District 6960 SHARE Committee

The District 6960 SHARE Committee's role is to establish and manage the district's policies and procedures utilized in managing District and Global Grants. Success is dependent on a thorough level of understanding by participating Rotarians and Clubs on how to effectively plan, budget, implement and conclude District and Global Grants utilizing Rotary Foundation District Designated Funds (DDF).

The District SHARE Committee

The District Grants Chair and Global Grants Chair, both non-voting members, in co-operation with the District Governor and District Foundation Chair, will schedule and facilitate all SHARE committee meetings related to their respective areas.

The voting members of the committee are:

- District Governor (DG)
- District Governor Elect (DGE)
- District Governor Nominee (DGN)
- District Foundation Chair
- 9 Club Representatives serving three-year staggered terms

Non-Voting members of the committee:

- Immediate Past District Governor (IPDG)
- Global Grant Chair
- District Grant Chair

Club Representative Selection Criteria:

The goal of the selection process is to insure broad representation of members in the District. The pattern of Area selection year by year will follow the same pattern used for the District Governor Nomination Committee.

Areas 1, 4 and 9 Areas 2, 3 and 6 Areas 5, 7 and 8

Selection Criteria:

A club representative from each Area will have a seat on the Committee based upon the highest per-capita giving Club from each Area from the average of three years preceding their selection period. Calculation of the most recent year per-capita shall be based upon donations reported as of July 15th to TRF to insure speedy selection to start the new Rotary Year.

Quorum/Majority

A meeting of 7 voting members of the SHARE Committee will constitute a voting Quorum. 51% or more of Voting members in attendance will constitute a majority vote. No Proxy Voting is allowed.

Vacancy

A vacancy in a Club Representative position, shall be filled for the remaining portion of the original 3 year term by the club the former Club Representative was from. If a Club chooses for any reason to not appoint a member it may be passed to the next highest giving per-capita giving club in that Area for that same selection/giving period.

District 6960 SHARE Committee

Responsibilities of a SHARE Committee Representative

The club Representatives should understand this is a three-year opportunity to serve. The Representatives will be asked to:

- 1. Be an ambassador to support the District with The Rotary Foundation
- 2. Commit to educate themselves on The Rotary Foundation Grant programs and Procedures
- 3. Be the voice of the general membership of Rotary as they execute the procedures
- 4. Help educate others within the District about this process
- 5. Be prepared to do Club Presentations when needed
- 6. Attend all SHARE committee meetings
- 7. Attend all District Foundation Seminars and Foundation Education meetings
