District Grant Process and Overview

2021 – 2022 Rotary Year

Where does the money for District Grants come from?



- Money sent by our district clubs to The Rotary Foundation Annual Program Fund 3 years previous to the current year, i.e. FYE June 30, 2019 for the upcoming Rotary year.
- 50% of total giving comes back to us.
- 25% goes to our district global grant program intended for international projects
- 25% goes to our district grant program intended for local projects in District 6960

Who will review the applications and allocate available funds

- District Grant Committee also known as SHARE Committee
- Changes to the SHARE Committee broader and more engaged club involvement
 - Ovoting members of the committee as follows: current district governor, district governor elect, district governor, district foundation chair and 9 club representatives each serving 3 year staggered terms. A club representative from each Rotary area in our district will have a seat on the committee based upon the highest per-capita giving club from each area for the average of 3 years preceding their selection period.

Overview of this Rotary year and next Rotary year



- This year we had 54 grant applications approved for a total amount of approximately \$240,000. Approximate funding came from \$200,000 provided from TRF World Fund (our 25% share from 3 yrs. ago) and supplemental COVID funding through Rotary International.
- For the upcoming 21-22 Rotary year it appears we will have in excess of \$200K coming back from TRF World Fund to use for district grants

Process to Administer District Grants



- Applications must be submitted on DACDB
- Application period is from April 1, 2021 through May 31, 2021
- The SHARE Committee will meet and review all applications for approval or rejection by July 31, 2021 and clubs will be notified shortly thereafter of their grant application status
- Once the SHARE Committee has determined the grants that will be funded a district spending plan will be submitted to TRF by our district foundation chair by August 15, 2021

Process to Administer District Grants



- Grant projects should not be started until TRF
 approves our district spending plan and an official
 approval is sent to the club from the district via email
- Once the project has been completed documentation of Rotarian involvement and expenses must be uploaded to DACDB and a final report completed in order to receive funding back from the district

Changes to District Grant Process



- Broader more empowered SHARE Committee
- No more club financial criteria or individual grant financial criteria other than minimum grant size of \$2,000 (\$1,000 club contribution and \$1,000 district contribution)
- SHARE Committee will review grant applications based upon TRF guidelines and community impact using the Four Way Test as it's guide
- Multiple club grants is encouraged by the committee

Points of Emphasis



- District Grant will fund a maximum of 50% of a completed project
- In general, the club or clubs must complete the project and document the expenses and Rotarian involvement in order to receive back from the district the approved grant amount limited to 50% of the total project cost
- District grants are approved on a single Rotary year basis district grants not designed to be multi-year projects
