Veterans sometimes find it hard to transition back into the routines of life outside the military.

A year-old Sarasota-based program hopes to make that transition a little easier by getting vets' hands dirty—literally.

The program, Green Path Veterans Farm, was started by the Florida Veterans for Common Sense Fund, says Gene Jones, one of the group's founding members. There was discussion in the group about the importance of local urban agriculture to help cut down on the energy wasted by transporting and importing food from other states and countries. The group also learned that if more food was locally produced, it could have a \$100 million impact on the local economy.

"If we could do just a fifth or a tenth of that," the program could be successful, Jones says.

Members also thought an urban ag project would help train veterans in

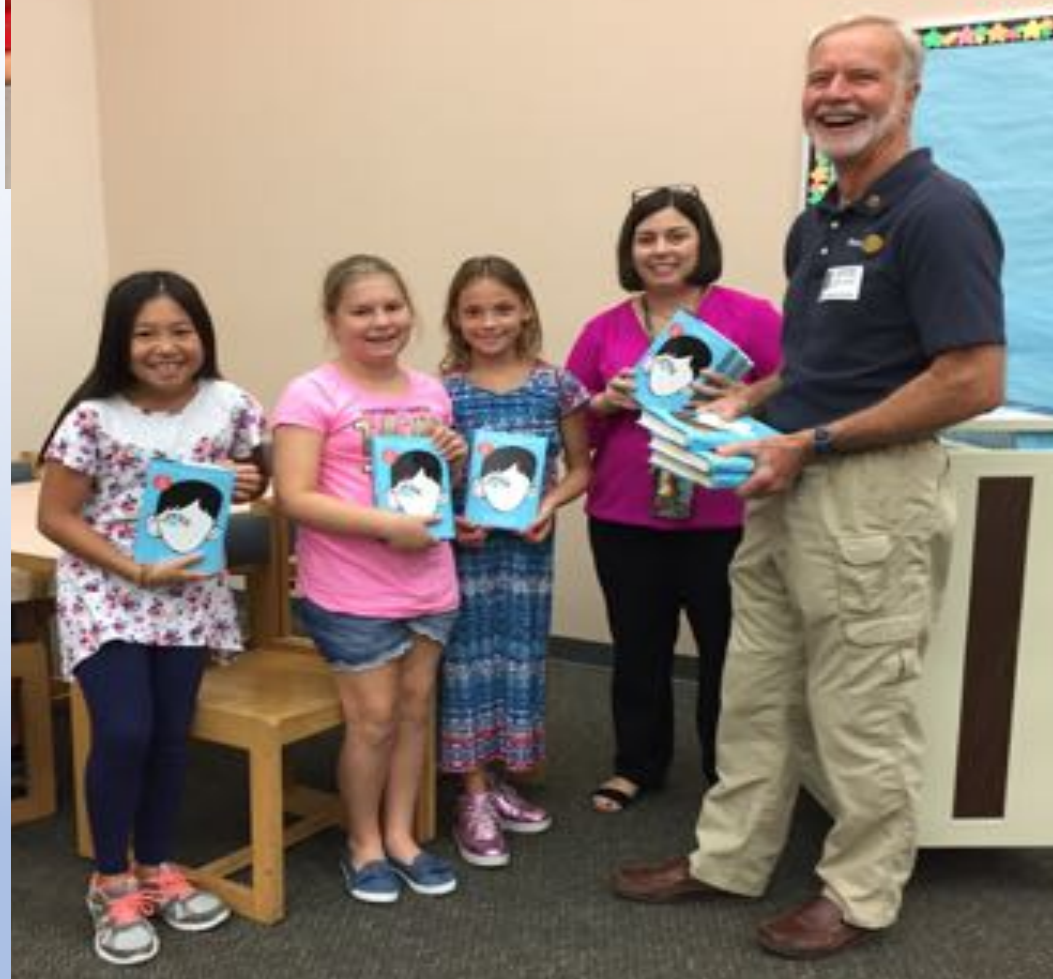

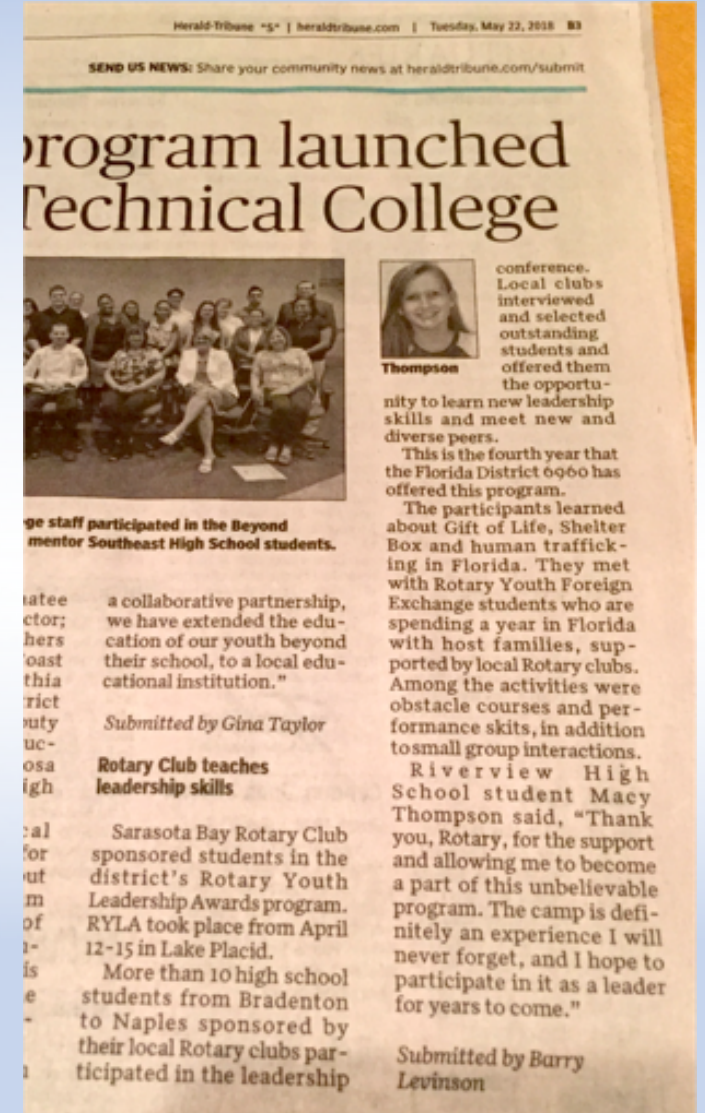

**Improve dealing with life threatening child's conditions & speed up child's therapy and recovery**

**WALL oxygen connection** is used in children who require oxygen support due to various lung diseases (eg asthma, bronchitis or bronchiolitis, cystic fibrosis etc)

**Wall Suction regulator (aspirator)** is used in children who require aspiration of secretions from the upper or lower respiratory tract

**Pulse Oximeter** is a non-invasive method of measuring oxygen saturation in blood. It reduces the need for frequent analysis of arterial blood, which is painful and traumatic for the child

**Vital sign monitor** enables fast and accurate monitoring of patients who require enhanced control of vital functions

**Anti-decubitus mattress** is used to prevent decubitus in children who are forced to lie down, are immobile or are recovering after extensive surgical procedures requiring particular "forced position"

**Reanimation sets (for breathing)** are ensuring a timely procedure for resuscitation in children who are for some reason isolated within the department or when transporting children to a remote diagnostic unit or other facility

**Apnea monitors** are used for surveillance and breathing control most often in infants and young infants and for preventing life threatening conditions in infants and young infants

**Professional inhalation device** are used for inhaling of aerosol dispensers in the upper or lower respiratory tract

**Immobilization board ( for reanimation purposes)** are used to secure the hard surface on which the resuscitation process is being carried out. Beds or mattresses are soft and are not adequate for heart massage or intubation

**Dr. Carol Probst** President of State College of Florida, Manatee-Sarasota addressed the club on a number of initiatives at the school. But first Mike Pender pointed out that she and her husband had lived in Sarasota and have traveled all over the world. She followed that and noted that her husband is still a father so when they school does it is the most peaceful times in life.

**Dr. Becker** received his Ph.D. in industrial-organizational psychology from The Ohio State University. He is currently a professor of management at the University of Florida Sarasota-Manatee where he teaches courses and conducts research in the areas of organizational behavior and human resource management. He has published many articles in scholarly journals on the topics of employment, motivation, research methods, and job performance.

There are 28 State Colleges in Florida with a number of branches. A main focus is on transfer degrees so that students can go on to other universities. Their flagship program is in nursing degrees where there is the largest demand. They have 4500 students in the program. Following that a vocational emphasis is in oneshall programs with 27 going on to play in the big leagues.

Dr. Probst tried to focus on the needs of the students in every way they can with on-line learning and evening and weekend courses. They teach responsibility and being on time in class. Studies that had actual research work showed up in class on time, regularly, and their grades were higher than students who had the hands on experience.

His awards for teaching, research, and service include a University Award in Teaching Award, the Shell International Excellence Award, a Mercator Fellowship from the German Science Foundation, the Belgian International Franco-Chinese Award, a Continuing Education Award in Research by the Tenure Award, an Advising Excellence Award, and the Seal of Distinguished Faculty Award.

The consortium of schools has allowed them to take classes at four different local colleges to focus on any area of learning. There are about 35 students that are being educated in micro brewing techniques, a lot up on local jobs in the growing market. She added "a most important job is to make sure that when kids graduate high school can join at the 12th grade level".

She has recently become interested in the topic of human resilience, particularly the resilience of U.S. veterans. Together with Professors Eric Hodges and Ram Govinda, he started the Veterans Resiliency Center. A goal is to help veterans by improving the lives of veterans in the area. Tim is here to discuss a current study on that topic.

### Last Week: Human Services Center



**Dr. Kameron Partridge Hodgins** is CEO of Sarasota's Glasser/Schoenbaum Human Services Center. She described her 5 acre campus of 14 buildings housing 20 nonprofits. This was to create affordable rent so that the non-profits could focus on their mission and not be fundraising for overhead. At \$8.50 sq. ft. the costs for them is less than half of what they would have to pay to stay in Sarasota. Dr Hodgins pointed out that the non-profits mission is not our mission. She tracks data for the organizations and noted that the Campus generates 17.3 million in funding serving 28,000 people providing 210 jobs for the servicing agencies. This is the only center like this in Florida at this time. She went over the history of Schoenbaum and the support in starting the center which was an effort by Dr Kay

## Rotary HomeStay Program brings world to Sarasota

Thirty-nine Rotary guests and spouses from 10 countries visited Sarasota Jan. 7-13 and stayed with local Rotarians as the Sarasota Bay Rotary Club hosted the 44th annual Cy Bingham DGE HomeStay Program.

The District Governor Elects were on their way to San Diego, California, for training with more than 500 other DGEs from around the globe. The guests stayed for a week in the homes of local Rotarians and had a chance to experience the Sarasota area.

This unique program furthers the understanding of different cultures and often results in reciprocal visits to their home countries.

While here, the guests visited the Ringling Museum, the South Florida Museum in Bradenton, and Myakka State Park. Host parties, shopping and visits to Rotary Club meetings filled the time between events.

The event culminated with a banquet at Michael's on East where guests experienced a special musical performance by the Booker Middle High School Jazz Band. Countries represented this year were the United Kingdom, Finland, Denmark, Germany, Austria, Croatia, Norway, Sweden, Turkey, Japan, India,

### Manatee County hosts special passport event

The Manatee County Clerk of the Circuit Court and Comptroller is hosting a special passport application event Saturday, March 24, from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. as an added convenience before the passport execution fee increases in April.

The event will take place at the Manatee County Historic Courthouse at 1115 Manatee

Ave. W. in Bradenton. The Manatee County Clerk of the Court staff will assist customers throughout the passport application process. Passport photos can be taken onsite for an additional \$16.05 fee. Effective April 2, 2018, the U.S. Department of State is increasing the passport execution fee from \$25 to \$35.

This fee applies only to U.S. passport applicants using the DS-11 form, such as first-time applicants over 16, children under 16, and applicants who reapply after reporting their previous passport lost or stolen.

The \$30 passport fee increase does not apply to adults eligible to renew their passports by mail using the DS-82 form. Renewal customers can mail their application and supporting documentation directly to the U.S. Department of State. Appointments will be scheduled in 15-minute increments with the last appointment time at 12:30 p.m. All customers requesting an appointment will receive an email reply confirming their appointment time.
