### District Grant Applications Approved!!

Both of our District Grant applications for Rotary year 2021-2022 have been approved!!

This means that together with our Club's contribution from our Charitable Fund, we will be able to create **LITERACY** and **NUTRITION**Projects for several organizations in the greater Sarasota area with a budget of \$4,500.00.

Not every grant application was approved by the SHARE committee for District 6960. The fact that our Grants are being used to address literacy and nutrition with our youth was very important for our funding approval.

#### **Books for Kids!**

One of the initiatives of our new District Governor is Books for Kids--Promoting Literacy mission to help raise the reading levels of elementary school students by providing the students with reading and listening comprehension skills, developing character traits and transferring the love of reading and the love of books from the reader to the child. There are 9 Clubs from District 6960 who are collaborating in this drive to bring literacy to our local communities through several methodologies including incorporating reading through other Rotary Programs such as "Dictionary Day" and "Josh the Otter". Our Club has agreed to spend \$1250 through this Grant with a request for a DDF match of an additional \$1250.

The Rotary Club of LBK is proud to be a part of this important Area of Focus Project. It is also worth noting that the next District Governor - Andy Lyman - has advised that this is one of his Major Goals for the next Rotary year. Our Club is represented on the District 6960 Literacy Committee by Nancy Rozance. Our FB page has a photo of Jack and Nancy Rozance, Andy Lyman and Ted Lindenberg - Chair for this Grant.
