# Hurricane Matthew Aftermath: Community and Service Above Self

Hurricane Matthew paid St. Augustine and the eastern coast of Florida a visit 12 days ago. Our town saw flooding not seen in almost 100 years. Many of our residents have lost most of their worldly possessions, and others suffered severe damage to their homes and possessions.

Members of our club were not spared damage; homes were flooded and possessions lost. Our spirit, though, and that of the entire St. Augustine community, grew stronger in Matthew's aftermath.

On the day after Matthew departed, I saw and heard from our Sunrise Rotarians as they helped our community recover. Neighbors and strangers alike joined forces to help those affected. Local business leaders reached out to the community in person and online to find out how we could help and to mobilize the community. Stations were set up to coordinate volunteers and supplies. The entire community stepped up to perform service above self.

Rotary District 6970 and our three St. Augustine clubs opened lines of communication for those who needed assistance. As a result, Rotarians have spent the past week helping in the community both physically and monetarily. Many of our club members spent much of the past week and weekend helping our neighbors, and the club donated \$1000 to St. Francis House this week to help them begin their road to recovery while continuing to support our homeless community.

Each and every one of you, members of the St. Augustine Sunrise Rotary, can be proud of the way you have responded to the aftermath. I am proud not only to be a Rotarian, but to be a St. Augustine Sunrise Rotarian. We have a long way to go to recovery, but there is no doubt that St. Augustine will recover. SAS – you are the best.

To the members of St. Augustine and St. Augustine Sunrise Rotary Clubs -

As most of you are aware, the St Francis House in downtown St. Augustine on Washington St. (which provides for the needs of homeless adults and families in transition) was destroyed by the hurricane. Residents (approximately 80) temporarily moved to Faith Community Church at 3450 CR 210 in St. Johns.

Thru INK!'s Exec Dir Donna Lueders, we asked First Coast Technical College in St. A if they could make meals for the residents. FCTC leadership took it upon themselves to visit with SFH kitchen manager Rusty this morning and found out that SFH is in dire need of meals for next week. FCTC is willing to cook the meals, but we need \$\$\$ so that FCTC can purchase the food at their School District pricing from regional vendors.

Denise Brown with FCTC is coordinating the menu with FCTC Chef Phil and Rusty now. We will have a price shortly. I imagine it will be somewhere between \$5000-\$8000, based on lunch and dinner for 80 for 7 days at (roughly!!!) \$5/meal.

And the following, in response to donations from our two clubs:

Thank you both for donations of \$1000 each to St. Francis House on behalf of the Breakfast Club and our noon Club. Please pass the gratitude of all those at St. Francis along to others.

I have attached a picture of the current 'Kitchen' on Washington St. being used to distribute food to all who need it. It is a far cry from the stainless steel facility that was in operation a week ago.

PS - Becky with St. Francis is still working with Denise at FCTC to see if something might be possible. Chef Phil called me this morning and was definitely ready to go. Hopefully, now that SFH has the cash in hand and I am out of the middle, something can happen there.

## A MESSAGE FROM RI PRESIDENT JOHN GERM:

### Dear fellow Rotarians,

We launched our PolioPlus campaign 31 years ago in a worldwide effort to rid the world of this paralyzing disease. Last July, we celebrated a milestone: Nigeria had gone one year without a new case of polio. But only a year later, three new cases of wild polio have been reported in that country and Nigeria has been reclassified as polio endemic.

The response to these cases has been swift; the Government of Nigeria – in partnership with the Global Polio Eradication Initiative – has already begun taking the necessary steps to prevent further spread of the disease both in Nigeria and the surrounding countries. After immediately approving US\$500,000 with a "rapid response" grant, Rotary is continuing to help mobilize support for the outbreak response on the ground in Nigeria. We have released \$8 million in funds to support response efforts in the Lake Chad basin, which will deploy new strategies to reach every child.

This may seem like a setback to many, but we are prepared now more than ever to continue the fight against polio, until no child is at risk and the world can be declared polio-free. We have overcome obstacles and outbreaks throughout the years. Polio can and will be eradicated in Nigeria. With your continued support and dedication, we can make that a reality.

In light of these recent developments, <u>World Polio Day</u> is an important event that gives us the opportunity to discuss the main issues at hand: focusing our efforts on ending the outbreak in Nigeria, reaching every last child in Afghanistan and Pakistan, and protecting the progress made in polio-free regions.

World Polio Day is everywhere. We hope to see scores of events around the globe. If you haven't already done so, <u>register</u> your event and download the World Polio Day <u>resources</u> to help make the event a success.

Rotary will also host its fourth annual World Polio Day event in Atlanta, Georgia, USA at the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Clubs and districts are encouraged to watch our <u>live-streamed global status update</u> at 6 p.m. EST or anytime after. <u>Spread the word</u> in advance with the help of our social media messaging and share graphics. <u>Donating</u> to our campaign will be matched two to one by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and help reach every child with the polio vaccine.

On 19 November, a team of Rotary staff will join Rotary senior leaders, club members from District 5500 (Arizona), and around the world in <u>El Tour de Tucson</u> to raise funds for polio eradication. Last year, the combined efforts of Rotary members and staff raised \$US4.4 million.

As fear of polio wanes, so does awareness of the disease. It's our responsibility to keep that awareness high and keep polio eradication at the top of public and government agendas. We must finish the job and End Polio Now, through Rotary Serving Humanity.
