STOP HUMAN TRAFFICKING - IS NOW AN ACTIVE GLOBAL GRANT

Labosco, the governor line and foundation chairs has taken up the mantel to lead this much needed campaign. D6980 has taken the point position, gaining the support of all 8 rotary districts governors, the 67 county sheriff officers, Orlando Metropolitan Bureau of Investigations, United Abolitionist, several state offices in Florida. The RC of Lake Nona has taken the helm to be the point club. We are asking all clubs in the district to support this worthy cause, whether by DDF contribution, man power, expertise, etc., D6980 global grants team is assisting step by step, as are all the collaborating partners.

D6980 EARLY ACT CLUBS RELAUNCH – Peace pole is coming.

A peace pole is being designed to be erected in honor of PDG Dan Semenza, as he was a strong supporter of Early Act, along with other distinguished Rotarians. Currently Phyillis Wheatley Elementary in Apopka has had their Early Act club up and running, under the leadership of Rotarian Tiquana Schuler of the RC of Apopka. Global Grants are still active and working. OUR global grants team is awesome, actually 2 members on the team have global grants that they are personally assisting.
