



# WHAT GLOBAL GRANTS SUPPORT

### **Global grants** can fund:

- Humanitarian projects
- Scholarships for graduate-level academic studies
- Vocational training teams, which are groups of professionals who travel abroad either to teach local professionals about their field or to learn more about it themselves

## AREAS OF FOCUS

- Peacebuilding and Conflict Prevention
- Disease Prevention and Treatment
- Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene
- Maternal and Child Health
- Basic Education and Literacy
- Community Economic Development
- Environment (Coming July 2021)

## THE LIFECYCLE OF A ROTARY GRANT

**Global grants** support large international projects with long-term, sustainable outcomes in one or more of Rotary's areas of focus. They range from \$30,000 to \$400,000.



#### **Draft**

Rotary members plan a project or scholarship and build their grant application online

#### **Authorization**

Club and district leaders review the application and authorize funding

#### **Submitted**

The grant's planners submit the application to The Rotary Foundation

#### **Approved**

If the grant is approved, the Foundation issues payment

#### Completion

Members carry out the project, reporting to the Foundation annually until the work or studies are finished and the grant is closed

- Must be completed each Rotary year
- Required to sponsor a Global Grant as either International club or Host club
- MOUs for 2021-2022 will be emailed to club presidents after the seminar

### DISTRICT MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU)

### Part 2. Club Leadership Responsibilities for Qualification

- C. All project documents will be scanned and stored in an appropriate and accessible digital archive.
- D. The club President-elect or a club designated appointee must attend the Global Grant management and training arranged by the district each year until the Global Grant is officially closed.
- E. All of the club's Rotary Foundation goals for Rotary Year 2021-2022 must be entered into the GOALS CENTER at Rotary Club Central on ROTARY.org.
- F. The Club must be fully up to date with all reporting on any ongoing Rotary grant activity.
- G. The Club must be fully up to date with all District 6980 and RI dues.
