# New Image Youth Center Adding Community Little Free Library™

[Parramore, Orlando, FL, USA, February 28, 2018] – At **4:30 p.m.** on **March 12, 2018**, a **Little Free Library**<sup>™</sup> will be dedicated at **1035 America Street** in the **Parramore District** of the **New Image Youth Center** (NIYC). A member of the **Rotary eClub of Florida**, applied for an **Impact Grant** of **Little Free Library**<sup>™</sup> (LFL) for the month of February 2018 and was awarded the library.

**Dr. Shanta Barton-Stubbs**, CEO of **NIYC**, welcomes the jumbo birdhouse-like structure and books to the neighborhood the center serves. "This **LFL** will help us provide year-round services to local children and adults helping to make Parramore a safe place to learn and play."

**Shawanda Jones**, the **LFL** steward and **NIYC** parent, has two boys and two girls from age five to fifteen. She states that, "reading is essential, and I am a big advocate. Reading teaches us and allows us to think big."

The mission of **NIYC** is to "change the path of at-risk youth though education and example." Barton explains that, "we have helped many of our graduates achieve their dreams of going to college." Students from NIYC will be included in the dedication ceremony and book reading.

Books are donated to LFLs, which now number over 60,000 world-wide, and freely borrowed and returned. There are libraries that are subject specific, like at the **Easy Access Women's Center** in **Pine Hills** and **Carter Family ACE Hardware** in **Apopka**, or of any title, i.e., **at Alonso Medical & Wellness Center** in **Forest City**, **Porkies Original BBQ** in **Apopka**.

Visitors may choose one or more books then return them to any location and borrow more. Often, visitors drop off books they own that they have finished. The **Friends of the Library** at the Maitland Library are important sponsors of **Rotary eClub of Florida** libraries.

The library kit and books are in the second grant **Dr. Phyllis M Olmstead**, Charter President of **Rotary eClub of Florida**, has won for central Florida in a year. Last February, the first **LFL Impact Fund** library was placed at 214 **W 10<sup>th</sup> Street** in **South Apopka** in memory of six-year-old **Camari Dennison**.

Rotary International clubs focus their efforts in six areas: promoting peace, preventing diseases, providing access to clean water and sanitation, enhancing maternal and child health, improving basic education and literacy, and helping communities develop (www.Rotary.Org, www.RotaryDistrict6980.org). The New Image Youth Center is in a tough part of Orlando called Parramore. The area is the traditional black community within Orlando. Division St is the road used in Jim Crow days to separate the black citizens from the whites. Education attainment is low and crime is high. This center reaches out to serve the at-risk children of the community to build capacity in the children and their parents. The LFL will make an incredible change in the community. We hope to put LFLs in front of the homes of many families attending the center. We already have many books for this location. NIYC provides academic support for all school levels, develops social skills, and provide daily meals, nutrition education, fitness functions, and crisis intervention counseling. The Pulse shooting occurred on the edge of the Parramore community.
