
Gene Pridemore had fun at the Honda Classic with great seats, bloody

Keith Keenan**

President of Gold Coast Fly Fishers

Keith moved to Florida 5 years ago and was formerly a fly fishing guide in Colorado. He met a lot of local fisherman at local fly shops and heard from many of the local fisherman that the fishing now was nothing like what it used to be.

This was partly due to the blue-green algae that affects fresh water caused by too many nutrients in the water from farmland. The other issue was red tide which occurs in the ocean after the excess nutrients from the blue-green algae reaches the ocean and feeds this red-tide. This red-tide impacts all marine life and even the birds that interact with the ocean life.

Keith hopes that Rotary can move forward with tackling this major issue to prevent the future death and destruction of the rich ocean wildlife that Florida enjoys. He did not have a plan of how to address this issue but hopes that Rotary can use its resources to make this an area of focus going forward.
