**Guest Speaker: Randy Brown**

Randy Brown has over 40 years' experience in many facets of the utility industry, Mr. Brown has worked for municipalities, operations and maintenance firms, private water companies and as an elected official.

For the last 14 years he has been with the City of Pompano Beach, as the Utilities Director. He earned an MBA from William Woods University in Fulton, Missouri. He is a double "A" licensed operator in water and wastewater and has earned his Green Belt in Lean Six Sigma from FAU.

Currently, Randy is the President of WaterReuse Florida Association and on the Broward County Water Technical Committee for the Water Advisory Board.

Randy thanked Rotarians Glenn Troast, Barry Dockswell and Anne Siren for their support. Pompano Beach Utilities treats 57.5 million gallons of water a day, through the use of almost 750 miles of pipes.

Purple Pipe legislation has come a long way. Purple pipe refers to the city's use of reclaimed water for irrigation. Originally only 73 homes elected to use reclaimed water. The Utility Department changed the rules and regulations to make it easier for homeowners to hook up to the purple pipes and it is now free. Lighthouse Point saw the value of hooking homes up to the purple pipe and made it mandatory for every in the city. At this time only 74% of Pompano Beach homes have adopted the use of purple pipe.
