## Dr. Winston Chu An Immigrant's Story



Is an immigrant's story important, especially this one? The answer is a resounding YES! Because every immigrant's story is unique especially for this nation begun mostly by immigrants and almost everyone is a descendant of one and how many of them enriched the American experience. Every immigrant experiences stages of 1) the push 2) the pull and naturally 3) the product.

Most commonly immigrants come for economic reasons, mine was because of ethnic and racial

strife and discrimination which was officially sanctioned.

This presentation will be a celebration of America as a refuge, the shining beacon and its educated citizens many of whom were cognizant of their own humanity, international responsibilities and selfimposed sense of duty. My story is unique especially because it began before I was born, when my father graduated in 1942 as a doctor in Burma as the Japanese Imperial Army marched into Burma.

He joined the British Army—Burma was British then—which retreated to India namely Ledo, Assam where they reached by marching through tropical jungles during the monsoon rains through kneedeep mud which thwarted fourwheel drive vehicles battling leeches, malaria carrying mosquitoes, dysentery and canker sores. My father met Dr. IS Ravdin commanding the 20th General US Army Hospital—comprised mostly of personnel from U of Pennsylvania who will play

a crucial future role. They were under the command of Generals Vinegar Joe Stilwell and Sun Lijen, who were architects of the LedoStilwell Road in northern Burma to supply China by land to replace flying over the Himalayan Hump.

ChinaBurmaIndia theater of WWII was won, my father fought all the way to southern China, met my mother and I was born in Burma. Flash to the slideshow to acquaint the audience to Burma, a beautiful country
