The Western PA Conservancy and its Work in the Erie Region



The Western Pennsylvania
Conservancy plants street trees in
downtown Erie, acquires lands in
the Erie area as destinations for
hiking, fishing and other outdoor
recreation, and restores streams
in Erie County. Tom D. Saunders,
president and CEO of the
Western PA Conservancy, will
provide an overview of the
Conservancy's work and highlight
its recent projects.

TOM D. SAUNDERS is President and CEO of the Western
Pennsylvania Conservancy. The Western Pennsylvania Conservancy
protects open space, conserves and restores rivers and streams,
plants trees, gardens and green spaces, protects rare, threatened
and endangered species, and preserves and shares Frank Lloyd
Wright's Fallingwater. Prior to his work at the Conservancy, Mr.
Saunders was a land use attorney at Brobeck, Phleger and
Harrison in San Francisco and Jones, Day, Reavis and Pogue in
Washington, D.C., Director of the Maryland Environmental Trust,
and Community Development Director of Gainesville, Florida.
Mr. Saunders has a BA from Vanderbilt University, a master's
degree in Public Affairs and Urban and Regional Planning from
Princeton University and a law degree from Stanford University.
Mr. Saunders serves on the board of the Pennsylvania Land Trust
Association and on the national Land Trust Leadership Council.


