## Bill Hagerty, CEO EmergyCare



Bill's entire career has been centered on public safety and specifically emergency medical services. This career has spanned 40 years working as an EMT, paramedic, flight medic, SWAT Medic Team Leader, EMS consultant, Erie County deputy coroner and differing levels of management. Bill currently serves as President & Executive Director of Emergy-Care and is responsible for the

oversight and management of the not-for-profit corporation which operates a large, high performance medical transportation system. EmergyCare consists of ambulance, wheelchair and medical taxi service divisions serving parts of seven counties in northwest Pennsylvania with operations in the City of Erie, Millcreek, Corry, Warren, Kane and Titusville.

Bill also serves as President of Corry Ambulance Service and Vice-Chairman of their Board of Directors. The Corry Ambulance Service is a joint venture between EmergyCare and LECOM Health Corry Memorial Hospital.

Bill has been a certified paramedic since 1979, pursuing his bachelor degree from the American College of Pre-Hospital Medicine, and is designated as a Certified Manager from the Institute of Certified Professional Managers/James Madison University.
