Erie Management Group: Medical Marijuana



Laura Guncheon joined Erie Management Group (EMG) in December 2016 as the head of Project Development as well as Marketing & Public Relations after serving for four years in the Pennsylvania Senate as the Director of Community Affairs & Public Relations for Senator Sean D. Wiley of the 49th District.

The first focus of EMG Project Development is to secure a one of the twelve

grower/processor licenses under the Pennsylvania Medical Marijuana Act of 2016 and to have the facility producing medical marijuana products by mid-2018.

Guncheon brought with her not only her experience navigating state government, but also management and develop skills after serving over a decade in the non-profit sector as the Case Manager at the Bradley H. Foulk Children's Advocacy Center of Erie County, Inc.

She earned a BA in Administration of Justice from the University of Pittsburgh at Bradford as well as a Masters in Administration of Justice from Mercyhurst University and was inducted into the UPB Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006. Currently, Laura serves on the Board of Directors of the St. Martin Center and Family Services of NWPA and is a member of the Erie Times News Readers Advisory Board. Guncheon was among the 2016 class of Erie's 40 Under 40 Rising Business & Community Leaders.

A native of Port Allegany, Pennsylvania, Laura lives in the city of Erie and cites her favorite place as Presque Isle's Kite Beach on a summer day.

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YOUR VISION FOR ROTARY'S FUTURE

In January, we invited you to participate in our survey *Your Vision for Rotary's Future*. If you are one of the participants, the Strategic Planning Committee sends a sincere thank you. Almost 30,000 members of the Rotary family, including 20,000 Rotarians, provided their input for Rotary's future! We are very grateful for everyone's feedback and want to share a few highlights of what we're learning:

- When asked about the traits of their ideal organization, almost all Rotarians (95%) and Rotaractors (97%) prize transparency and accountability.
- According to Rotarians, the two top benefits of membership are 1) positively impacting their local community and 2) friendship/fellowship.

In the results, we are also learning where Rotary can improve:

- Almost a quarter of Rotarians say that their Rotary club conducts too few community service projects; even more (41%) feel their Rotary club is involved in too few international service projects each year.
- Many Rotarians (42%) and Rotary alumni (49%) are frustrated with Rotary's slow pace of change.
- Only 36% of Rotarians fully agree that Rotary acts upon feedback from its members.

We hear you and want to reassure you that we are taking action with the survey feedback. Your Vision for Rotary's Future survey results are an integral part in the development of a Vision statement for Rotary. Our goal is a Vision statement that is compelling, inspirational, and aspirational -- a future towards which all Rotary aspires to reach and reflects the impact Rotary wishes to have on the world. Once developed, the Vision will guide the creation of a new strategic plan and set a direction to ensure Rotary's ongoing growth and long-term success.

Rotarian input is essential at every step of the project. To ensure the Vision fully captures the shared values and priorities of Rotary, the Strategic Planning Committee will continue talking to Rotarians and members of the Rotary family at all levels and all parts of the globe. In the next several weeks, you may be asked to provide input to help develop the Vision. We hope you will participate if you receive a request.
