# Jeffrey Hileman Director of Communication, EUP





Jeffrey Hileman became director of communications at Edinboro University in October 2012 following an extensive career as a newspaper editor and reporter. His responsibilities at EU include media and government relations; planning and executing extensive internal and external communications; and serving as the spokesman for a public, regional, comprehensive university with an enrollment of more than 6,000.

He works closely with Edinboro University President H. Fred Walker to communicate Dr. Walker's transformative initiatives to address challenges facing higher education nationwide, of which EU is a microcosm. Central to this work is frank transparency about the need to enhance student success, bring expenses in line with revenues and refresh the academic program offerings while clearly conveying the fundamental strength of the university as an academic community and economic force in the region.

A graduate of Indiana University of Pennsylvania, Hileman has been a resident of Erie since 1988 and worked for 24 years as a writer and editor for the Erie Times-News before becoming a member of the Edinboro University staff.




