Prescription Drug Take Back Program and the Opioid Epidemic

She is both a licensed pharmacist and attorney in Pennsylvania.

Kim has been a professor at the LECOM School of Pharmacy for over 14 years, and her teaching responsibilities include Pharmacy Law and Ethics and an elective advanced practice rotation site at the Erie



County Department of Health. In addition to her academic career, Kim practiced community pharmacy for over 15 years and has consulted on various legal cases regarding pharmacy law issues. Kim has also written a number of papers and commentaries, and has made presentations at the local, state, and national level on a variety of pharmacy law topics.

Here is a quick recap of events to occur this year at District Conference and how you can help.


