

## Jerry Clark, Retired FBI agent




JERRY CLARK retired as a special agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation in 2011 after twenty-seven years in law enforcement, including careers as a special agent with the Drug Enforcement Administration and the Naval Criminal Investigative Service. He received a PhD in public service leadership from Capella University, an MA in forensic psychology from the City University of New York John Jay College of Criminal Justice, and a BA in psychology from Edinboro University of PA.

Clark is an associate professor of criminal justice at Gannon University, where he chairs the criminal justice department. He is also co-owner of Clark & Wick Investigations LLC. He lives with his wife and two children in Erie.

### Ed Palattella, Reporter

ED PALATTELLA joined the Erie Times-News, in 1990. He has won a number of awards, including for his investigative work and coverage of crime. He arrived in Erie after reporting for the Point Reyes Light in Marin County, California. Palattella received an MA in journalism from Stanford University and a BA in English literature from Washington University in St. Louis. He lives with his wife and two children in Erie.


