Tom NewPresident/CEO of WQLN





Tom New is president and CEO of WQLN Public Media. He is a graduate of the Art Institute of Pittsburgh, and Penn State University. He has worked in the Erie television for 41 years - celebrating his 20th Anniversary at WQLN last December.

Tom is married to Fran, has two married children, and two granddaughters.

Tom worked as director of creative services for ABC affiliate WJET-TV from 1978 to 1998. He began working at WQLN in 1998.

From 1986 to 1990 Tom served as president of the ABC Television Network's Northeast region's promotion advisory board.

New was the executive producer of eight documentaries produced for the Pennsylvania Public Television Network. He is a three-time winner of the Pennsylvania Association of Broadcastings award for excellence.

New was the winner of the 2004 Erie Advertising Executive of the Year. He is passionate about Erie, and volunteers to develop community projects that educate, entertain, and (in one way or another) enhance the quality of life in the greater Erie area.

In 2006 New received the Mister Rogers Neighborhood Award for creating Erie's Heritage Festival. The event included a summer pops concert with a dramatic presentation of Tchaikovsky's 1812 Overture with live cannon fire and fireworks. New was the creator of Erie's Heritage Hall and the web project Ethnic Erie. For his work on these two projects he was awarded the Erie County Historical Society's President's Award in 2010.

In 2012 he was awarded the George Mead award for distinguished Service.

There are 76 Peacebuilder Clubs in the US, only 8 of them in the Northeast. They started in Oregon in 2011. Peace will be an increasing area for the Foundation and RI as we transition away from Polio to the "Plus" part of Foundation activity. District Governor Scott Bayline encourages Clubs in the District to join Erie in becoming Active Peacebuilder Clubs - one member serves as Chair of the Peacebuilder Committee and as a member of a District-wide Peacebuilder Group. The minimum requirement is for each Club to do at least one independent peacebuilding-related activity annually and to participate in a Districtwide activity each Rotary year. These can be locally-focused outreach or education, or they can have a global impact.

Peacebuilding activities can be related to peace directly or to any of the six Rotary areas of focus, as they are all considered to be contributors to peace:

- Peace and conflict prevention/resolution
- Disease prevention and treatment
- Water and sanitation
- Maternal and child health
- Basic education and literacy
- Economic and community development
