





About PeaceJam...

Lead by Rotary International Peace Fellow Wisdom Addo, the project is aimed at providing training on peace building which focuses on creating a culture of peace through nonviolent approaches (community building, communication, conflict resolution, human rights, social justice, patriotism, good citizenship, global responsibility, neighborliness and religion's role in peacebuilding).

WACPF will implement the PeaceJam curriculum with 600 students from 20 different schools in the Senior and Junior High School level through the PeaceJam program that explores the adolescent stories of 14 Nobel Peace Laureates and the strategies they used to overcome problems in their lives and their communities. There are different versions of this curriculum that are age-appropriate, which can be used with youth age 5-25.

Now a Peace-Builder Club, the Rotary Club of Erie has supported PeaceJam since 2014.
