James Grunke Erie Regional Chamber



James Grunke came to Erie and the position as President/CEO of the Erie Regional Chamber in September of last year. James brings more than 25 years of experience in economic development leadership roles to the position.

James has had key roles at a number of economic development organizations, and at chambers of commerce. During his 6-year tenure at the Missoula

Economic Partnership in Missoula, Mont., the community gained 10,000 new jobs while attracting nearly \$1 billion in capital investment. The partnership assisted more than 100 new start-up companies and helped to attract more than 30 companies that relocated from other areas.

Before moving to Montana, James worked as Project Director for Atlanta-based National Community Development Services, where he led successful campaigns that raised nearly \$20 million for community and economic development priorities in several communities. He created and led chapters of the Keiretsu Forum, a network of accredited private equity angel investors, venture capitalists and corporate investors, in Boise and Sun Valley, Idaho. He also held leadership roles with Idaho's Boise Valley Economic Partnership, Washington County Economic Development Commission and Orofino Chamber of Commerce.

James holds Bachelor of Science and Master of Public Policy degrees from Boise State University. He also is a graduate of the University of Oklahoma Economic Development Institute – widely regarded as the nation's premier economic development educational program – and the Northwest Community Development Institute, an intensive three-year training program for economic development professionals, community leaders and elected officials.

Everyone who signs in at the April 10, April 17 and 24 meetings receives an entry for the tickets.


The random drawing will be held at the May 1 meeting and you must be present to win. Also, your dues must be current thru March 31, 2019.

Dear Friend in Rotary,

I'm writing to ask for your help in promoting the Rotary Youth Exchange outbound School Year program to high school students in your area. We are now accepting applications from students to study and live in another country during the 2020-21 school year. It would be great if you – or others from your clubs – would deliver flyers, brochures and posters to your local high schools, and inform students about this opportunity for intercultural learning.

The Rotary Youth Exchange program offers high school students from the U.S. and other countries the opportunity to live and study in another country during a school year. Participating students learn about new cultures, learn to speak a new language and make friends with people from around the world. The program's objective is to foster world peace, international understanding and good will by extending international communication at the personal level through the exchange of students of high school age.

Eligible students should be of good character and reputation; be approximately between the ages of 15 to 18½ at time of departure; have above average academic ability; and have a pleasant personality.

The student's share of expenses include a \$450 youth exchange program fee, airfare, insurance and other travel costs. The program is for one school year and the hosting Rotary club will provide housing with host families, food, schooling and a monthly allowance. Attached is some information.
