Ron DiNicola

Erie at Higher Education Crossroads



Ronald DiNicola is an Erie lawyer with a national law practice. He was born and raised in Erie, the son of an Italian immigrant bricklayer. He served in the U.S. Marines, graduated first in his platoon from boot camp at Parris Island and a year later won the All-Marine Corps Boxing Championship. He attended Harvard University on the G.I. Bill and earned a degree in government. After graduating from Georgetown Law School, he served as a law clerk to Chief U.S. District Judge Gerald Weber in Pittsburgh and Erie.

DiNicola is known for his representation of leading figures from the worlds of business, entertainment, sports, and politics. Over the years, he has taken up numerous causes in the public interest. He structured and served as legal counsel to the [Warren] Christopher Commission in the aftermath of the Rodney King beating in Los Angeles. He successfully represented thousands of laid-off Erie G.E. workers who were twice denied federal benefits by the U.S. Department of Labor. He recovered over a million dollars for Amnesty International in a civil case in Long Beach, California. From 2010 to 2013, he served as Erie County Solicitor. As Solicitor he drafted term limit legislation that became law and he took legal action to prevent the designation of Erie County as a rural county for state funding purposes. DiNicola co-chaired the Pre-K for PA campaign in Northwest Pennsylvania. He co-chairs Knockout Homelessness. He led the effort to bring back the Erie Police Athletic League. He co-founded Empower Erie, and led the effort to gain local passage of the Erie County Community College Plan.

DiNicola is the recipient of the 2012 NAACP Spirit of the Community Award and the 2015 "Voice for Children Vision Award" of the Pennsylvania Association for the Education of Young Children. He has been named "Man of the Year" by the Giuseppe Mazzini Civic Association.




