

Support the Rotary Club of Erie Scholarship Foundation



Started in 1956, the Scholarship Foundation of the Rotary Club of Erie is the principal and longest-running service project in the Club's history. In July 1960, the Endowment Fund of the Scholarship Foundation was established "to receive gifts, legacies, and bequests."

Over the years this endowment has grown, and the earned income helps support the program.

Eligible students must reside within the City of Erie, attend either Erie High School or NWPA Collegiate Academy, be accepted to a four-year institution, and exemplify Rotary's motto *Service Above Self*. The Foundation normally gives 3 scholarships to Erie High students and 2 to Collegiate students of \$3,000 each for an annual outlay of \$15,000.

Each June, the checks are presented at a Rotary luncheon to which the students, their counselor, and their parents are also invited. The scholarship can be used as needed by the students. Often they are used to pay for books, other needed equipment or sometimes even a car to help them get to class.

Over the past decade, the Foundation has also been the vehicle by which we have gathered and distributed funds for the Haiti School Campaign, the Rotakid program, 10 Ethics Symposiums, a LEAP campaign for South Africa, and Wisdom Addo's Annual PeaceJam conferences in Ghana.

As a 501(c)3 separate from the Club itself, the Erie Rotary Scholarship Foundation is eligible to receive matching funds on **Erie Gives Day**. In 2019, we had 8 donors and the total after the match was \$968. In 2020, we had 7 donors and the total after the match was \$1,238. This year it is on **August 10**. We are grateful for these funds, but as Rotarians, we can do more to support our own program. Please consider our Scholarship Foundation as you make your contributions: <https://www.eriegives.org/>.

The Rotary Club Board of Directors were so impressed with Janyssa's approach to them, they were happy to help. Joe will continue to discuss this with Gannon's Business School in the hopes that we can work with our own Scholarship Foundation to sponsor a student annually for such an opportunity.

Janyssa had the choice to live in a dorm either with American or with Italian students and she picked the latter, immersive choice. She says, "I'm Puerto Rican and I speak Spanish, so I'm sure I will pick up Italian much easier by living with Italian students."

She has pledged to keep in touch and will check into our Club meetings periodically via Zoom to update us on her progress. *Arrivederci!*


The Rotary Club of Erie has supported the PeaceJam Leadership Conference held in Accra, Ghana for the past decade, thanks to late Rotarian Dr. Joyce Miller's experience in Thailand as a certificate Rotary Peace Fellow. There, Joyce not only learned about building peace, she found herself a lifelong friend. Wisdom Addo leads the [West Africa Centre for Peace](#), which is the Ghana Chapter of

the [PeaceJam Foundation](#), a non-profit organization hosting an international education program connecting African youth with Nobel Peace Prize Laureates with the goal of creating a generation of young people committed to positive change in themselves, their communities, and the world.

Wisdom is an exceptional young man from Accra, who has just completed his MA in Peace Studies as a [Rotary Peace Fellow](#), one of only 50 people to be selected for this

program from across the globe.

Congratulations, Wisdom! Wisdom reported to us that "Last year, the funding we received from Rotary clubs of


