

1. President and President Elect Matters

- District match paperwork completed and we will be getting the district match money. All \$3000 is in Inspired Hearts and Hands possession.
- Looking forward to a big crowd at Night at the Races on February 9. UPDATE: The February 9th fundraiser was a great event with strong attendance and we believe a great fundraiser.
- Dave is attending PETS (March 1-3).
- Board positions for next year - Dave needs to get moving on completing this.
 - President-Elect (Dave), Past President (Tom), Secretary (Mac), Treasurer (Gary), Foundation (Jim K), International (Lou) and new Community Relations position (Jim L) are established.
 - Other board positions: Public Image, Club Service, Community Service, Programs, Membership, New Generations and President Elect need to be established (some may be asked to do again next year)
 - (Not a board position) but Dave will establish a Sargent at Arms – greeter and log-in person at meetings
- 501c(3) pursuit - Dave and Gary to pursue legal/accounting team to do this work and determine cost which can be shared by the Club, satellite and impact club.
- Golf outing committee finalizing contracts with Butler CC (golf and banquet) and meeting on 2/7 to get moving. UPDATE: Golf committee met and actions are underway.
- Dave to attend Ethics Training on March 5 within schools happening in Erie club in District 7280. Dave would like to import this training into our high schools and also possibly local colleges like LaRoche and Chatham.
- The board agreed that Club Assembly via Zoom has very limited attendance and is not working. Mac suggested that we consider integrating a crisp Club Assembly update into a regular meeting and the Board seemed interested in this approach starting in March. NOTE: after the meeting Dave read that Rotary only requires Club Assembly once/quarter – our Club like many others chooses to do this once/month.
- Later this week you will see plans for the February 14 Club Assembly intended to do our traditional update across all committees then have an interactive session where we gather input from our members on future plans as well as prompt them to help us find new members and ideas.
- Sales Tax Exemption – see attachment I for decision from the Board Meeting.
- District Conference is May 17-19, 2024 (multiple board members plan to be there/rep for Rich-Mar).

2. Secretary Report - Mac noted no changes to our rolls since the last meeting.

3. Treasurer Report See attachment II income/expense report. The Foundation met and agreed to give us the \$8000 requested for scholarships although they need to work through how to pull this from the investment portfolio. Dave noted that the income/expense report does not show that we sent the \$1500 for the Beattie scholarship. Gary to follow up.

4. Membership Committee

- SBCBA social on January 18 was good for Public Image. It did not recruit many potential members but did result in Mindy Schnitgen interest.
- Board approved Nick Guido and Adam Blythe as new members.
- Committee participated in the January 27, 2024 district membership summit to increase rolls – committee will collect items to pursue to spur membership growth.

5. International

- Lou plans to provide the remaining \$650 in his budget to Hearts for Haiti. The Board acknowledged.
- PR High School Interact Club will meet with us on February 15 (at 2:30) to discuss plans for the Walk For Water Event, which has two dates: April 11 for an in-school presentation and May 20 for the actual event (3pm).

6. Programs:

- Roger updated us on programs (see Attachment III) and Mac ensures DacDB calendar is up to date. Roger has suggested several potential topics in his 2/6/24 e-mail and all are to provide input to Roger.
- Shelter Box wants to talk at our meeting again this year.

7. Foundation:

- Jim Long was not present but provided the Attachment IV update on giving. Dave is going to contact Jim Kirschner to see if he can help Jim Long now so Jim can concentrate a bit more on Community Relations.

8. New Generations

- Mars Interact Club – they are polar plunging on Feb 23 (School Day). We are likely going to donate \$200 to them out of Matt's New Generations budget.
- PR Club: they are now certified by Rotary as an Interact! Dave and Matt providing Interact Club Resources from Rotary to the club. PR and Mars Interact Clubs are working a joint project with Inspired Hearts and Hands prompted a bit by the Club.
- Next Student Recognition in February on the 21st – Matt is handing.
- World Affairs youth meeting has 13 students and 2 chaperones going across the two high schools! This is a great turnout since there were zero attendees last year.
- Both Mars and PR Principals want to push more Rotary Youth Exchange. Dave to work with district reps to get PRSD Board to approve the Rotary program and get the Mars Exchange Club to more readily acknowledge Rotary Youth Exchange.
- We need to get confirmation from Chuck Berry that he is handling RYLA signups for this summer.

9. Club Service and Public Relations

- Social with SBCBA was successful on January 18.
- Seth working on glitches so our Instagram account is up and running – then how do we use it or hook with other entities like the schools and communities.
- Working on media coverage at our next Student Recognition on Feb 21


10. Community Service

- 2024 plans so far

 - March 22 – we could help the Satellite at Camp Spencer

 - June – date TBD – team with Satellite at PRC Recycling Event
- Need to finalize plans with MHY and their playground (March/April) - installing the surface on the new special needs children playground (no expertise needed) and would greatly appreciate a mulch donation and spreading in the spring. Karen Harvey is the new POC at MHY due to Amy Smith's departure.

12. Community Relations

- Mars Clock – Delivery will be much earlier than expected. Dave working with Mars Borough on delivery and eventual installation once Spring weather arrives. Dave needs to finalize the donor plaque.
- Richland project possibility(historical marker within the Richland Park) – scoping underway. UPDATE: Jim Long talked to the Richland Historical Society rep and he is enthusiastic about a joint project.
- Awaiting a list of Mars Borough Events for 2024 to see what to support
- May be getting in touch with Adams and Valencia to see what their future needs might be
- Pine (6/22) and Richland (8/12) community days - Pine would like us to run the Pie and Watermelon Eating Contest (food is donated by others) and we agreed to do this. We need to send in application and settle on plans for Richland – any ideas from the Board are appreciated.
- Gary suggested we consider sponsoring a military appreciation banner that Pine is going to be installing. The Board said we would send something out to the membership to see if anyone wanted to be pictured and then we would fund it.

Rich-Mar Club wants to pursue a sales tax exemption. This would save money (e.g. prepared meal costs and other expenses at Club/Satellite Events, socials, fundraisers and any PA-based costs associated with the Appalachia Impact Group expenses for their trip).

PA requires the club bylaws to state they are not for profit motive or the benefit of any member. This is what we do now, but don't state such in our bylaws. The Board has agreed with adding to Article 9 the following for congruency with our sales tax exemption submittal:

Section 7 – Revenue collected from Club fundraising or received from the Club Foundation are to be used for charitable purposes to those in need within the community or on an international basis. A minor portion of the revenue is used for expenses of running the Club. The Club does not operate for any private profit motive. If the Club is dissolved, remaining funds will be provided to community/international charitable causes and cannot be provided to any member of the Club.

The bylaws require a vote by membership with a quorum voting for the amendment.

Bylaws of the Rotary Club of Rich-Mar

Article 1 Definitions

1. Board: The club's board of directors
 2. Director: A member of the club's board of directors
 3. Member: A member of the club, other than an honorary member
 4. Quorum: The minimum number of participants who must be present when a vote is taken: one-third of the club's members for club decisions and a majority of the directors for club board decisions
 5. RI: Rotary International
 6. Year: The 12-month period that begins on 1 July
-

Article 2 Board

The governing body of this club is its board of directors, consisting of, at a minimum, the president, immediate past president, president-elect, secretary, and treasurer. Additional members may include the chairs of Club Service, Community Service, New Generations, International, Foundation, Public Image, Membership, Special Events and Speakers.

Article 3 Elections and Terms of Office

Section 1 — One month before elections (See Article 5, Section 1), members nominate candidates for president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer. The nominations may be presented by the board, by members from the floor, or both.

Section 2 — The candidate who receives a majority of the votes for each office is declared elected to that office.

Section 3 — If any officer or board member vacates his or her position, the remaining members of the board will appoint a replacement.

Section 4 — If any officer-elect or director-elect vacates a position, the remaining members of the board-elect will appoint a replacement.

Section 5 — The terms of office for each role are:

President — one year

President Elect — one year

Treasurer — one year

Secretary — one year

Section 6 — All other board member positions will be by appointment by the President Elect.

Article 4 Duties of the Officers

- Section 1 — The president presides at club and board meetings.
 - Section 2 — The immediate past president serves as a director on the club board.
 - Section 3 — The president-elect prepares for his or her year in office and serves as a director.
 - Section 4 — A director attends club and board meetings.
 - Section 5 — The secretary keeps membership and attendance records.
 - Section 6 — The treasurer oversees all funds and provides an annual accounting of them.
-

Article 5 Meetings

- Section 1 — An annual meeting of this club is held no later than 31 December to elect the officers and directors who will serve for the next Rotary year.
 - Section 2 — This club normally meets on Wednesday at 12:15 PM. Reasonable notice of any change or cancellation of the regular meeting will be given to all club members.
 - Section 3 — Board meetings are held each month. Special meetings of the board are called with reasonable notice by the president or upon the request of two directors.
 - Section 4 — The club shall have at minimum one "Club Assembly" meeting per month to inform the membership of decisions of the board.
 - Section 5 — The club will hold a regular meeting at least twice per month which can include "Club Assembly"
 - Section 6 — Additional monthly meeting can include club service projects and socials.
-

Article 6 Dues

Annual club dues include RI per capita dues, a subscription to The Rotarian or a Rotary regional magazine, district per capita dues, club fees, and prepaid meals for those that do not qualify for the rule of 85. Dues are paid semi-annually.

Article 7 Method of Voting

The business of this club is conducted by voice vote.

Article 8 Committees

- Section 1 — Club committees coordinate their efforts to achieve the club's annual and long-term goals. Each club should have the committees listed in article 13, section 7, of the Standard Rotary Club Constitution.
 - Section 2 — The president is an ex officio member of all committees and, as such, has all the privileges of membership.
 - Section 3 — Each committee's chair is responsible for the regular meetings and activities of the committee, supervises and coordinates its work, and reports to the board on all committee activities.
-

Article 9 Finances

Section 1 — The board shall prepare a budget of estimated annual income and expenditures in July for approval at the August Board meeting.

Section 2 — The treasurer deposits club funds in a financial institution or institutions designated by the board.

Section 3 — Bills are paid by the treasurer or another authorized officer and approved by two other officers or directors.

Section 4 — It will be the policy of the Club that funding for requests received by the Board or Service Committees be limited to Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00). If a request is received for funding in excess of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), for a specific need or project, the board has the discretion to honor such one-time requests but the need or project must have a specific start and end date.

Section 5 - Club members will receive an annual financial statement of the club.

Section 6 — The fiscal year is from 1 July to 30 June.

Article 10 Method of Electing Members

Section 1 — A member proposes a candidate for membership to the board, or another club proposes one of its transferring or former members.

Section 2 — The board approves or rejects the candidate's membership within 30 days and notifies the proposing member of its decision.

Section 3 — If the board approves the candidate's membership, the prospective member is invited to join the club.

Article 11 Amendments

These bylaws may be amended at any regular club meeting. Changing the club bylaws requires sending written notice to each member 10 days before the meeting, having a quorum present for the vote, and having two-thirds of the votes support the change. Changes to these bylaws must be consistent with the Standard Rotary Club Constitution, the RI Constitution and Bylaws, and the Rotary Code of Policies.


