Rotary Peace Garden Maintenance Tips

1. The Peace Garden is divided into four quadrants with four perennials flowers:

Coreopsis "Sunkiss"
Echinacea purpurea "Coneflower"
Leucanthemum superbum "Crazy Daisy"
Lavender "Phenomenal"

- 2. Corn gluten, e.g., Preen, should be applied in the early spring to minimize weed germination.
- 3. A balanced fertilizer, e.g., 10-10-10, should also be applied to the beds except for the lavender.
- 4. No fertilizer should be applied to the lavender, which prefers poor soil.
- 5. The beds should be watered as needed. Note: The lavender requires minimal watering, e.g., during dry periods.
- 6. Mulch will be applied and maintained by the Public Works Department.
- 7. While corn gluten will minimize weed germination, some weeds will appear and should be removed on a regular basis.
- 8. Generally, clippings should be removed to keep the beds and paths neat and tidy.
- 9. Flowers, except the lavender, should be deadheaded as needed to promote reblooming.
- 10. In the fall, the plants, again except the lavender, should be cut back to two to three inches.
- 11. In the fall, lavender should be cut back as described in this article:
