1. Briefly describe the proposed project. What will be done, when and where will the project take place, and who will benefit from the project?

Replacement of existing kennel (see attached seven (7) photos) with six individual kennels w/attachable weatherproof canopy (last photo) and privacy fencing between each kennel. See final page for cost estimates.

2. How many club members will participate in the project and in what role? Is there a cooperating organization also involved and what will their role be?

No other organization will be involved in this project. However, calls will be made to local hardware companies for the "best price" they can offer to the CPHS. Four to six club members will participate. Additionally, the CPHS will have two to three staff members and two to three volunteers.

3. How will the project benefit the community? Approximately how many people will benefit from the project? During 2020 there were 435 dogs taken in by the CPHS.

The project will provide safe and secure housing for surrendered, abandoned and stray animals who are in need of a forever home. There are many individuals and families who are no longer able to take care of their pet(s) for a variety of reasons. The CPHS affords the owners with peace of mind knowing that their pet will be well taken care of both indoors and outdoors.

Donations to the CPHS will be used to supplement any additional costs above the grant amount of \$2,958.00.

5. How does this project reflect the mission of The Rotary Foundation?

The project will provide the former owners of the dogs with human understanding of their need to surrender their pet, while the goodwill of the CPHS and staff will provide a safe, loving, nutritional, warm, dry space for the dogs, giving peace of mind to the former, their family members and the dog. Compassion can be found by simply helping others who are faced with choosing between their pet and the health, nutritional, and welfare of the family. In some instances, funds previously used by the pet owners for the nutritional, veterinary and housing needs of the dogs can now be used to stave off poverty. When the CPHS receives a request for adoption of the dogs, educational material is provided on the responsibilities of being a pet owner and the average costs (nutritional and medical) of raising a dog.

Clubs must have entered at least 13 goals for the 2021-22 fiscal year in MyRotary by September 15, 2021




Clubs must disclose any conflicts of interest and cooperate with any District or TRF audit.

We have decided that the best route for replacing the small dog kennels would be to purchase individual dog kennels with attachable weather proof canopy's. These are easily set up and are secure for what our needs are. We will need to Purchase 6 of these. They will be place beside each other in a row. We also would be placing the fence panels between each run so the dogs would not have a visual of the dog beside them.

Individual 6'x4'x8' dog kennels from Amazon $\$362.51 \times 6 =$ **\$2,175.06**

Vinyl Flat top fence panels from Lowes 6'x8 $117.66 \times 7 =$ **\$823.62**
