1. Briefly describe the proposed project. What will be done, when and where will the project take place, and how many people will benefit from the project? How will the project benefit the community?

Funds will be used to purchase items for the Hope Chest Foster Closet, Bloomsburg, located in two rooms at Wesley United Methodist Church. The Hope Chest is Dwell's foster closet. This is a space for foster, adoptive, and kinship families that receive emergency placement of children to come and gather a week or two weeks worth of clothing and necessities to help them get through the initial trauma and transition. A representative of Dwell Orphan Care came to speak to our club about the organization and the work they are doing in our area. Several members are interested in volunteering time with Dwell and helping with fundraising and operating needs.

We will absolutely use the funds immediately, as each care package and hope box combo equals about \$500 retail value. If we receive less than the amount requested, we will reduce the number of items offered to fit within our budget unless we can find another funding source.
