Rotary Club: Rotary Club of Shepherdstown, WV Project Title: 2022 Back to School Back Pack Project

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Describe the project. What was done, when, and where did project activities take place?

The Back-to-School Backpack project was developed to provide up to 120 needy elementary school children with a backpack filled with school supplies required by the schools for purchase by parents. The program included three Jefferson County, WV Title 1 Schools and a low-income day-care center for needy students. A Title 1 school is defined as having 40% or more of its student body coming from low-income needy families. The four schools included in the project are identified below:

- 1. T.A. Lowery Elementary School;
- 2. North Jefferson Elementary School;
- 3. Ranson Elementary School; and
- 4. Shepherdstown Day Care Center.

The supplies used to fill the backpacks were obtained from a bulk school supply vendor and meet the requirements developed by each school for its returning students. A total of 30 backpacks per school were provided to school administrators for distribution to selected needy students.

2. Who were the beneficiaries, how were they impacted by this project, and what humanitarian need was met? How many people benefited from this project?

Project beneficiaries included a minimum of 120 students, at least that many parents, to many participating teachers, and to the 70 members of the Rotary Club of Shepherdstown for knowing they are contributing to the well-being of our community.

The **project provided much-needed assistance** to **needy families** struggling to obtain school supplies for their children. The current shrinking economy and sky-high energy and food costs have stressed already meager budgets to the breaking point. Something as simple as assisting them with school supplies ultimately **benefited the community, participating schools, parents and importantly, the kids themselves**. Hopefully, the supplies provided to each student will last through the 2022-2023 academic year.

3. How many Rotarians participated in the project? What did they do?

A total of 24 club members participated in the project. In addition, 17 volunteers consisting of Rotaract and Interact students, spouses and members' children also helped to organize supplies and fill the back packs.

Some of the key activities performed by the members included the following:

- Prepared the District Grant proposal;
- · Provided liaison with the four participating schools;
- Researched school supply vendors;
- Organized supplies at the Shepherdstown Community Center;
- Solicited matching donations from Club members;
- Coordinated volunteers, work assignments, schedules and times; and
- · Delivered the filled back packs to the four participating schools.

4. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

The four recipient schools identified above were the cooperating organizations in the project. However, no funding assistance was provided by any of the schools. Their roles in the project were to identify and distribute the backpacks to those needy students they deemed most appropriate.
