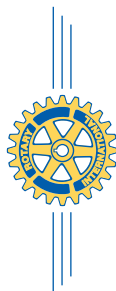

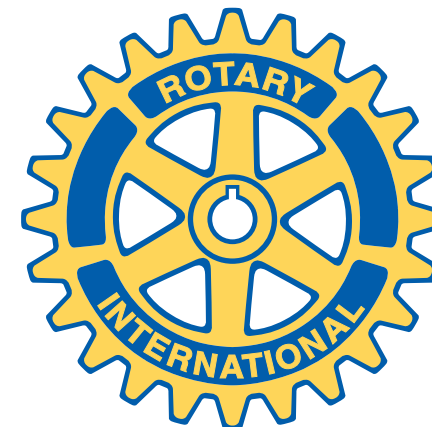

Bright Spot develops Websites, etc. (Impactix works with nonprofits). Impactix helps communities to help themselves Alan is originally from Columbia but has been here for many years. Alan spoke about Peru, communities not helped by govt agencies. Described the negative impact of govt intervention. Residents received stoves but didn't know how to use them, too cold- new stoves didn't keep the house warm so they used the old ones, which also helped deter rates. You need to talk to the end user.
