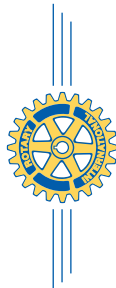

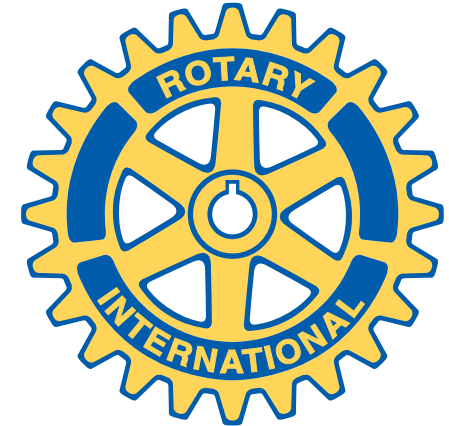

Speaker- Deb Dellaposta

Deb reported on her small business, DellaVino imports. In 2012 she went to Australia Balossa valley, where she visited Brockenchack winery. They wanted to get their wines into the states. Deb formed a company with two others and studied under a sommelier. She walked through the steps of becoming an importer. This then morphed into the first Grapes for Good raising \$24,166 She traveled to Italy and found wine makers, got a license after jumping through all the legal hoops. In 2019 Australia wines arrived in time for Grapes for Good, raising \$35,670 and Grapes for Good continues to raise funds for non-profits, raising over \$40k in 2020 and \$35,038 in 2022. Deb's temperature-controlled warehouse is under DBB. Deb is the staff, with a part-time salesperson is commission only.
