

Speaker: Jeffrey Holland

Pastor at 2 parishes in the UMC Bald eagle and Graziervile Jeffrey is on the board of directors for the Blair County Historical Society and shared the history of transportation in Blair County. His dad and uncle were bus drivers. Grandfather ran streetcars and trolleys in Johnstown then transportation in Altoona. Altoona and Logan valley electric company.

The streetcars got the rail workers to the shops, homemakers to shopping and students to school. Horse drawn streetcars for five cents. July 4,1891 electric cars came into play. 1894 Lakemont was operated by the trolley company as a free service to entice people to use the trolley and pay to ride to the free park. 1900 Tyrone electric railway began, but only existed on its own for about 2 years and was bought out by American railways company. The last streetcar in Blair County ran on August 7, 1954

Speaker: Mike Sell, St Francis project coordinator at the Institute for energy

Wind Energy in Pennsylvania. Mike shared the history of wind energy 1888 first electric generating wind device Pa had a dozen models in the 1900s. 2000 first commercial wind farm in PA. One wind turbine can power 3-5 hundred homes. There is a high upfront cost but over time, wind can be cost effective. You need a windy location... 14-15 mph Transmission access and roads for equipment are important.

Challenges: radar, airports, proximity to buildings, they can catch on fire. All development on private property Four birds, twenty-seven bats killed per year. They last 20-30 years and are 90% recyclable \$100k for small turbine
Utility scale three mil per turbine
Patton wind farm has fifteen
The next frontier is the ocean
