

After several family tragedies, his grandfather managed to keep the business going and bring on a partner who had more business knowledge. The company expanded to include paper supplies, rip tickets and other items. For years they supplied Sheetz and other mom and pop stores. They followed the trends and in 1999, opened Nicks tobacco outlets and Nicks Grab n Go.

In 2000 they created their website, www.Blaircandy.com and Pam Macharola now runs e-commerce from Florida 15-20 pallets of candy are shipped weekly, worldwide to include Universal studios and Disney. Impact of the current economy has resulted in shipping that cost the company nothing to shipping that costs \$9k. Global bottlenecks have caused problems with specific items such as, popcorn cups and beer cups. Big league chew is nonexistent. Half of from Laroche university the candy stocked by Blair Candy is made outside of the USA. They are the only company carrying Bunn candy bars and Skye candy bars. They pay special attention to the nostalgic candies. Blair Candy employs 50-60 full-time employees.
