Julie Rockwell, East Broad Top Railroad Archivist. Yesterday the Broad Top received a new passenger car. Julie shared what EBT is and why it is important. 1872 was the groundbreaking of the railroad. EBT is a narrow gage line. It is the oldest surviving narrow gage in the US. It was used to move coal from the narron Broad Top region. They have a Baldwin engine. EBT offers a nearly intact collection of photos and ephemera. They have been declared a National Historic Landmark. The rail runs from Mt. Union to Robertsdale. Julie shared the vibrant industrial history and the role it played in the community with jobs, materials and local transportation for students and others.

EBT offers Mine tours, rail car rides and a wealth of information for geologist and economic historians. Julie is digitizing all the information available. They partner with the Rockhill trolley. For more information visit www.eastroadtop.com
