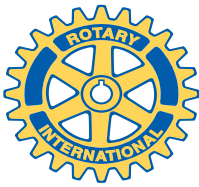

Tim O'Brien Young Life along with three Young Life Youth, Patrick, Ella and Carl. Young Life has been around for 43 years. It is an interdenominational Christian Organization introducing adolescents 16-27 to Jesus and helping them grow. Adults earn the right to be heard by building relationships with teenagers and spending time in their world. Tim noted that the average family only sits down for meals together three times per week. Youth average 9 hours per day on electronics. Sixty-one percent of kids with a faith background will leave when they go away to college. Young Life is working to reduce those numbers. Young Life has expanded to 105 Counties. It has been in the US since 1974. Young Life clubs meet weekly - at Tim's house often. Last week he hosted seventy-six kids. The Summer camp trip hosts five hundred kids. Carl had the opportunity to serve on the Work crew -15 hours days unpaid. He had to pay \$20 to work there. He expressed how close you become to total strangers. He served 1300 kids over 3 weeks. Young Life will host a Sept 23rd golf outing at Park Hills
