Speaker- Steve Sheetz shared the Sheetz annual update. Sheetz did unbelievably well during Covid It has been difficult to get labor . 1904 began the Sheetz story with Grandpa JE Harshbarger Dairy. Steve shared the history of how the stores developed by the family.

All his relatives were Sheets. His dad was one of nine and changed the name to Sheetz.

Now the z gets used everywhere

At 12 you went to work, and Steve went to work for his brother Bob in 1960.

1972 Sheetz opened 24hrs with free coffee and fountain drinks for police

The stores do \$65000 in food and beverage per week. Chick-Fil -A does \$100k

Sheetz will sell two billion gallons of gas this year. They have 140 tankers, 440 drivers

1952-present

Sheetz is in 6 states, has 650+ stores, over 24,000 employees had \$11.5 billion in revenue in FY2022 They currently have nineteen stores in Columbus Ohio and in 1.5 years plan to have opened 75-80 and are in the process of selecting the next new market. Challenges- hiring, thrive and grow as electric vehicles take over. Three states have said no more gas vehicles built after 3035. Sheetz is now investigating what other businesses they could pursue.
