Our speaker was Justin Smithmyer, city of Altoona Fire Inspector and Lucille, certified Arson detection k-9. Lucille comes from Main Specialty Dogs, where she failed as a seeing eye dog. She is a good fit with Justin's family. The make up the only certified team between Pittsburg and Harrisburg and are one of only 150 teams between here and Canada. Lucille is a food trained dog which means she only gets fed when she trains. She must be trained daily, and Jason constantly needs to change the amount of food. He noted that she is the best partner he has ever had. Lucille is three and will work for at least 5 years. She could potentially serve 10 years and live to eighteen. State Farm funded the purchase and training of Lucille. She is valued at \$35,000. Lucille could sniff out an arsonist in the crowd and alert on them. A fire scene could be completely gutted, and she could find the accelerant several feet down. She can identify 20-30 distinct kinds of accelerants and will lay them down

Speakers; Lisa Purcell and Heather Fleck North Star Support Service North Star is a private, non-profit, supports coordination organization located at Lakemont park. They serve Blair, Bedford, Somerset, Centre, Mifflin, Juniata, and Huntingdon counties. They are tasked with locating, coordinating, and monitoring services to 724 individuals with intellectual disabilities. The goal is to support these individuals in having everyday lives. The agency began in the seventies, providing case management. North Star also has an early intervention component for children birth to age three who have or are at risk of having developmental delays. They had 486 referrals in 21/22.
