

UNB is also used to get the entire picture for individuals experiencing Dizziness and vertigo. They are working with the American Institute of Balance. Program; Paula Foreman introduced our speakers; Rick Hoover and Dutch Brennan of the Altoona Area School Board

They spoke of the history of the decision to close Wright Elementary based on a projected decrease in student enrollment that never occurred. Students moved around to other elementary schools but the numbers never really dropped. Today's students need space for group work, technology, etc.. that warrants the construction project that is taking place. The Junior High will take on the role of a Middle School, serving grades 6-8 with 9th going to the high school. AASD is currently serving approximately 7,500 students, with 232 enrolled in cyberschool or 3% of the population at the cost of \$2.3 million. The state average is 6-7%.

Our guests spoke of addressing the needs of the future and current concerns, such as bullying and drugs.
