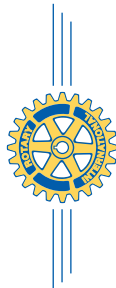

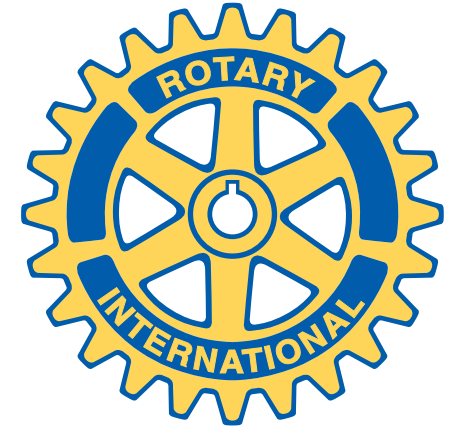

founded by the Johnstown Diocese in 1920. Ten years ago, BG became its own 501c3 because the diocese wanted to divest itself of the school. What BG aspires to be is the private high school for the area. There are many outreach efforts to enroll students from other religious denominations. The focus is on students being responsible for their own learning and the teachers are there to help the students learn. The Canvas IT system is used to post assignments and students use this system to prepare their lessons.

Joe indicated that the saddest piece of news it that people still believe that BG is only for Catholics. Scholarships are available for those students who are financially needy. This year is the last year that BG will receive any funding from the diocese. He believes that BG will exist if the community wants it to exist.

An example of a program that BG developed with a local company and Mount Aloysius College that enabled students to work and go to school and achieve a college degree sooner than usual. This work experience combined with education prepared students for the workforce.

Enrollments are up at BG and the budget is balanced. There is some conversation about changing the name of the school. It now has 75% of the students from the Catholic faith. There are also students from China who enrolled in the school.

The focus of BG will continue to be on becoming the area's private school known for innovative educational opportunities and solid family values.

Kate Shaffer introduced our speaker, Neil Port. Neil is one of the partners of Empower 3 Center for Health. He shared the history of Dr. Gates efforts in creating an office for the working poor at the cost of 1.3 million dollars, which was significantly less than traditional practices. The hospital was impressed with the decrease in the use of the ER by the general population. Dr. Gates was catching problems sooner. Out of this, Empower3 For Health was born. This is a Primary Care Office that charges a monthly fee for unlimited access to wellness care including labs, a nutritionist, pharmacy consult and more. Telemedicine allows for access to eight UPMC Specialists in Pittsburgh. Empower3 has offices in Altoona, Pittsburgh and Johnstown. Their goal is to have 20 offices.
