### Program

Our speaker today was Marcus Ickes, Executive Director of Explore Altoona. Marc shared that Blair County has led the largest percentage of increase in traveling spending within the Allegheny region, with a 7% increase in 2017. Our new hotels opened during a period when there was a 13% increase in demand and that demand continues to increase. We have also led in travel spending across seven other markets. Advertising dollars are spent outside of Blair County to draw people in. Visitors bring money into Blair County. There is a grant program available to assist with County of Blair tourism marketing and in 2018, over \$30,000 was given. Explore Altoona participated in the Main Street roundtable, helping to build a strong, appealing downtown.
