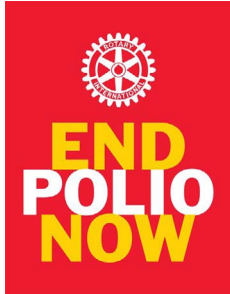

WHEREAS, Rotary is a global network of neighbors, friends, leaders, and problem-solvers who unite and take action to create lasting change in communities across the globe; and

WHEREAS, the Rotary motto, Service Above Self, inspires members to provide humanitarian service, follow high ethical standards, and promote goodwill and peace in the world; and

WHEREAS, Rotary in 1985 launched PolioPlus and in 1988 helped establish the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, which today includes the World Health Organization, U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, UNICEF, and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, to immunize the children of the world against polio; and

WHEREAS, polio cases have dropped by 99.9 percent since 1988 and the world stands on the threshold of eradicating the disease; and

WHEREAS, to date, Rotary has contributed more than US\$2.4 billion and countless volunteer hours to protecting nearly 3 billion children in 122 countries; and

WHEREAS, Rotary is working to raise an additional \$50 million per year, which will be leveraged for maximum impact by an additional \$100 million annually from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation; and

WHEREAS, these efforts are providing much-needed operational support, medical staff, laboratory equipment, and educational materials for health workers and parents; and

WHEREAS, in addition, Rotary has played a major role in decisions by donor governments to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort; and

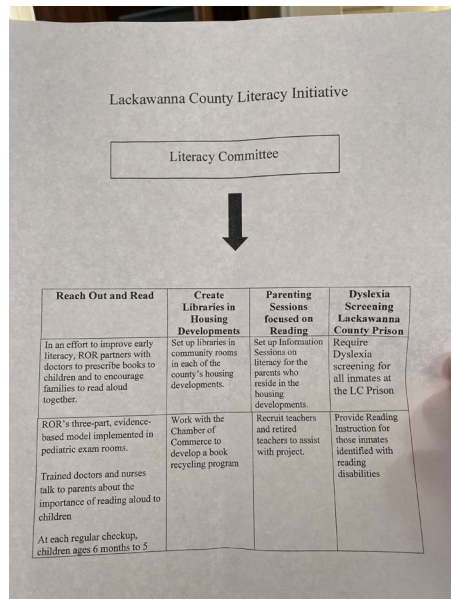

*** Oral language is conceptualized as a critical foundation for building core literacy skills. It is the process of extracting, constructing, and integrating meaning from oral language discourse. This process includes several component skills, including vocabulary, syntactical, grammatical knowledge, background knowledge, verbal working memory, attention, inferring, comprehension monitoring, and nonverbal visual-spatial skills. Difficulties with oral language can affect the acquisition of reading and writing skills.

In the U.S. alone approximately one hundred million children and adults have difficulty reading. The cognitive, linguistic, academic, emotional, social, and physical health consequences of their reading difficulties significantly diminish their opportunities in school, work, and life. In the aggregate, reading difficulties skew our democracy, drag our economy, perpetuate poverty, and cost U.S. taxpayers hundreds of billions of dollars each year. Reading proficiency is our nation's most wide-spread and costly learning disability and nothing short of a complete REFRAME in how our society thinks about 'what's at stake' and 'what's involved' is going to improve the situation.

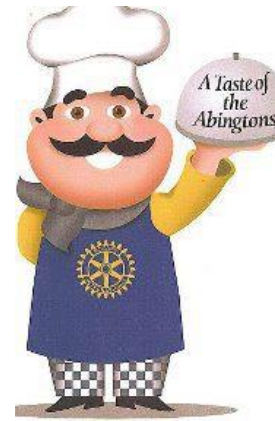
Taste of the Abingtons

Jim Thorpe Rotary Ghost Walks Kicks Off 2022 Season

For 23 years, the Jim Thorpe Rotary has held the annual Ghost Walks from September to December. Lantern-wielding costumed storytellers have shepherded thrill seekers through the historic streets of Jim Thorpe. Men, women, and children, couples and families, stroll around the West side of town, formerly known as Mauch Chunk. Tales of eerie happenings, intermixed with the history of the town are woven together to form an interesting narrative. The people who built these fantastic structures are long gone, but thanks to the art of storytelling, participants in the ghost walks are transported to another time to learn about the lives of past residents – and how they ended.



Club president, Jeanne Miller, a member for over 20 years explains: “The wonderful thing about the Jim Thorpe Rotary Ghost Walk is that not only is it a fun experience, it also supports the children and families in our community.

What many may not realize is that this endeavor is a charitable operation. Jim Thorpe Rotary has organized the Ghost Walks since 1999 and have raised over \$190,000 to fund local community programs such as a free 8-week long summer camp for children, scholarships for graduates, a Christmas clothing drive for needy children, and funding local charities and organizations.

Clem McGinley notes: “It’s a very popular activity that requires a lot of volunteer effort/coordination with all our Rotary members and guides (who run the walks). The Ghost Guides are excellent and the success of Ghost Walks is directly attributable to them. Our current guides are Casey Parker, Eric Bloom, and Kelly Fritz, with Mindy Mankyo filling in as needed. Of course, there are many other guides who have contributed over the years, and deserve credit too.”

In 2021 alone, the Ghost Walks entertained more than 1,000 people. Bob Stevenson & Mary Mulligan and Clem & Sophie McGinley have done most of the coordination: scheduling Ghost Hosts & Ghost Guides, selling tickets by phone, managing finances, etc. This year, the club is excited to announce that they have moved the ticket sales online to make it easier for participants and organizers alike.

Ukraine Relief Aid

This past spring my New Milford Area Rotary joined with the Plains Rotary to send monetary contributions to a Rotary Club in Warsaw Poland. Other clubs and individual Rotarians in District 7410 also contributed to the Ukrainian disaster relief efforts through direct club to club efforts and via the Rotary International Disaster Response Fund that was specifically targeted for Ukraine.

Since then, our District and leadership have begun an effort with five other Rotary Districts and Rotary International to facilitate a Global Grant to facilitate continuing relief efforts in Ukraine. A combined District grant will result providing \$125,000. This grant is for housing and bedding for the Ukraine community. The community this grant will address has 7,000 people and only shelter for 156 of them. District 7410 is the overall lead District. Paperwork has been approved at Rotary International and we are just waiting for the funds to be issued.

This effort does not preclude individual Rotary clubs from aiding this critically urgent effort, made more critical by the impending start of winter in the Ukraine.

Recently the Rotary Club in Warsaw, Poland, mentioned above, reached out with a request for additional monetary assistance. I have simply cut and pasted that request below, so as not to lose any of the spirit of this request from fellow Rotarians in Poland.

"At the moment we are preparing new projects that only can be possible if we will be able to collect additional funds."

We are working on following project:

- Maintenance of refugee shelter at St. Faustina pilgrim's house. It needs additional support of circa 2500 USD monthly (less than 100 USD per capita).
- First four months after war Polish government assured financing for all bodies taking care of refugees. Now it is ended and we are financing it from collected donations, but funds are smaller and smaller.
- Delivery of hospital mattresses to Ukrainian hospitals. We have cooperation with UK company delivering second hand but particularly good hospital beds to Ukrainian hospitals. Each bed needs new mattress that costs 120 USD. We have financed 3 truckloads where 50 beds and mattresses are loaded but demand is growing, and funds are) now.
- We are trying to provide to areas where infrastructure is damaged potable water filters. In many places people are using water from streams or ponds what is dangerous, but they have no option. We have two clubs from Minnesota and non-Rotarian sponsors collecting amount of 15000 USD necessary to purchase in US and deliver to Ukraine 1000 water filters. One filter will provide clean potable water to family.
- We need funds to provide more food in form of instant soups and canned meat. Best way is to buy it in Poland at manufacturers cost and we know how to deliver it to Zaporozhija and further to East Ukraine.

We are receiving more individual demands needing immediate reactions and we try to convince our Rotarian friends to contribute, as no smallest penny is spent otherwise than for direct help.

We are ready to make zoom video conference with district or club leaderships. It gives much better possibility to explain why help for Ukraine is necessary now and will be necessary for long time from now."
