

## Article 12

### Section 3.

The Rotary Club of Oyster Point creates a corporate membership program for businesses, professional practices, partnerships, limited liability companies, government entities, educational institutions, not for profit organizations and other nonpolitical entities designated as the "Corporate Member". This membership category recognizes the growing importance that businesses place on corporate social responsibility.

1. **Qualifications.** The Corporate Member shall be a local business entity as described above with employees, members, managers and officers who desire membership in the Rotary Club of Oyster Point and subscribe to the virtues of Rotary International.
2. **Application.** A Corporate Member application shall be delivered to the Board for review and approval. The application shall provide the name, address and other requested information of the applying entity and its designed "Primary Member" as defined below. All applications shall be reviewed under the same standards as provided in these Bylaws including "professional classifications". A Corporate Member may be a member of up to two Rotary Clubs so long as the Primary Member is only a member of the Rotary Club of Oyster Point.
3. **Individual Members.** The Corporate Member shall designate employees, managers members and officers to serve as Members of the Rotary Club of Oyster Point by notifying the Secretary of the Rotary Club of Oyster Point. The Corporate Member shall appoint its "Primary Member" and up to three "Alternates."
4. **Primary Member.** The Corporate Member's designated "Primary Member" shall be an employee, director, officer or principal decision maker of the Corporate Member.
5. **Alternate Members.** The Corporate Member's designated "Alternates" shall be employees, members, managers and officers of the Corporate Member.
6. **Attendance.** Attendance and participation requirements of the Rotary Club may be met by any of the Members. All Members (Primary and Alternates) are entitled to attend any regular meeting of the Rotary Club of Oyster Point or any other Rotary Club as determined by that club.
7. **Dues.** Dues for the Corporate Member shall be set by the Board of Directors in the ordinary course of club budgeting. Dues for each Corporate membership to the Rotary Club of Oyster Point shall include fees and dues due Rotary District 7600 and Rotary International for the Primary Member and social and meal costs for the Primary Member and all Alternates.
8. **Rotary International Registration.** The Corporate Member's Primary Member for whom Rotary International dues have been paid is registered as an active member in the Rotary International and Rotary District 7600 databases. The Primary Member shall be listed as a member of the Rotary Club of Oyster Point and noted in the roster as the "Primary Member" of the named Corporate Member. Alternates for the Corporate Member for whom Rotary International and Rotary District 7600 dues are not paid are not registered on the Rotary International nor the Rotary District 7600 databases but are listed on the Rotary Club of Oyster Point database, including its website and marking attendance for internal purposes.
9. **Votes and quorum.** For the purpose of general meetings and club matters, the Primary Member is eligible to cast one vote. The Primary Member may designate a Corporate Member Alternate attending the meeting at which the vote is taken to have his/her proxy

10. **Holding office.** Any Rotary International dues-paying member listed in the Rotary International and Rotary District 7600 databases is eligible to hold office. The designated Primary Member shall be eligible to hold elected and designated offices in the Rotary Club of Oyster Point. Corporate Member Alternates are not eligible to hold office and board positions in the Rotary Club of Oyster Point.
