

Williamsburg Rotary Club Service Project

Rotarians are guided in their daily lives by a set of valued principles developed over the years to provide Club members with a strong common purpose and direction. Significant among the body of principles is the Rotary Four-Way Test which helps nurture and embody the ideal of service by asking all members this: “of the things we think, say, or do:”

- (1) Is it the Truth?
- (2) Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- (3) Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- (4) Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

In the spirit of abiding by the tenets of the Four-Way Test, the Williamsburg Rotary Club is proudly engaged in a partnership with the Greater Williamsburg Outreach Mission (GWOM), the From His Hands (FHH) Christian Faith Ministry, and Meals on Wheels to deliver hot nutritious meals to families in need. On the third Wednesday of each month, a Team of volunteers from the Williamsburg Rotary Club gather at the Williamsburg Indoor Sports Complex (WISC) to collect freshly cooked hot meals prepared by Meals on Wheels. These meals are then transported and delivered to homeless families living in temporary accommodations across our community. Coupled with this effort is a similar project where the Club provides prepared hot meals to the Williamsburg House of Mercy for distribution to community residents in need.
