THIS WEEK IN HISTORY

April 21.1509. With the death of Henry VII, his eldest surviving son assumed the British throne as Henry VIII

April 18.1775. <u>Paul Revere</u>, a renowned silversmith, is better remembered as a folk hero of the <u>American</u> <u>Revolution</u> who this night in 1775 made a dramatic ride on horseback to warn <u>Boston</u>-area residents of an imminent attack by British troops. The war started the next day.

April 21.1934. The *Daily Mail* printed a photograph that reportedly depicted the small head and neck of the <u>Loch</u> <u>Ness monster</u>; the iconic image, widely known as the "surgeon's photograph," sparked an international sensation but was later revealed to be a hoax.

April 18.1942. U.S. Lieutenant Colonel James H. Doolittle led 16 <u>B-25</u> bombers on a spectacular surprise attack on <u>Tokyo</u> and other Japanese cities; the <u>Doolittle Raid</u>, as it became known, caused little damage but boosted <u>Allied</u> morale.
