James Wheeler enlisted in the Marine Corp at age 17, In February of 1944. He was in action on the battle of Iwo Jima from February 19 - March 16, 1944. He served 2 years in the Marine Corp. After graduating from college he was recruited by the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA). During his tenure he served twelve of thirty of years of service overseas in Asia and Europe.

Prior to retirement from the CIA, he served as an assistant director of finance for the Agency. He then was instrumental in the inception as vice president at Usatrex International, Inc. A world wide security government contract firm. Presently, Mr. Wheeler is a media consultant on the subject of Iwo Jima; he is frequently asked to provide lectures based on his experience as an Iwo Jima Veteran and has been interviewed on numerous occasions by producers for documentaries. He has implemented a popular Facebook page for Iwo Jima Veterans and their families to share stories.

Mr. Wheeler holds a Bachelor of Business Administration degree from Loyola University in Los Angeles, CA and a Master of Science in Technology and Management from American University; he then completed the esteemed M.I.T. Sloan Executive Education.

Partners for Surgery

Frank Peterson delivered an update to the club regarding Partners for Surgery in Guatemala, an organization which he started after seeing a need for basic medical care while visiting his son who served in the Peace Corps in Guatemala in the early 1990s.

Partners for Surgery has been successful in encouraging both those in the US and Guatemala to provide medical services to impoverished rural, majority Mayan, populations. Frank commented that the recent election of a new President in Guatemala has raised hopes across the country for better provision of basic services for all Guatemalans.

Frank shared a video prepared by two Guatemalan volunteers telling stories of the efforts of Partners in Surgery.

After providing background about Guatemala and the Mayan people, who compose half of the country's population, Frank highlighted the solvable problems that the country confronts, including malnutrition, illiteracy, and lack of access to basic healthcare.

Partners for Surgery provides services throughout central Guatemala through community efforts expanding far beyond surgery to addressing some of these core basic healthcare needs.

Those needing medical attention hear of Partners for Surgery's services via battery powered radios and through church networks and are invited to come to surgical sites set up throughout the countryside. Transportation can prove to be challenging both pre- and post- surgery.

Most recently, a team of 15 volunteers traveled down to Playa Grande, near the Mexican border. Hundreds of women lined up in front of their temporary health center to be seen by doctors.

Since 2001, over 40,000 people have received medical care through Partners for Surgery including 7,000 who have received facilitated surgeries.

Thanks to donations from the McLean Rotary Club and other clubs, a formal surgical center with two operating rooms has been set-up that draws talented surgeons from around the world to provide reconstructive surgery, hernia operations (a large percentage of which are for women) and a range of other procedures.

Efforts are underway to be able to transition the management of the current surgical center to a team of Guatemalans and .

Partners for Surgery is at the forefront of providing care in rural communities and Frank thanked the club for its ongoing support.
