Program – April 16 by Jan Auerbach

Adam Cromie, Director of Baseball Operations for the Washington Nationals, gave Rotarians some insight into how a baseball team operates behind the scenes. He has been with the club for seven years, starting as an unpaid intern. He works with scouts, Breshkie Gardizi, Founder, Dog helps analyze data on players, and participates in sessions with General Manager Mike Rizzo on deciding what players should join the team through draft or acquisition. He said Manager Davey Johnson tells the staff the type of player he believes he needs but doesn't participate in the actual selection process to identify the player. He said his most exciting moment was being in the clubhouse when champagne was flowing the night the team made the playoffs last season. He said the first two days after the final loss to the Cardinals were very down days but then everyone got down to work and started to plan for the coming year. He said most teams in the National League East division rely more heavily on scouting than analytical tools, with the Phillies being the one team that professes to rely entirely on scouting. He said the Nationals do not own their minor league affiliates but some other teams do and the trend is in that direction. The Nationals pay minor league player and coach salaries and expenses related to medical and training support. The minor league club pays all costs associated with the ballpark and keeps all the revenue.
