Program - January 22

Mark Looney gave an overview of the ongoing development of the Metrorail Silver Line and Tyson's Corner. 23 miles of new Metrorail lines are branching off the Orange Line after E. Falls Church, and 11 new stations are proposed: 5 new stations in Phase 1 and 6 new stations in Phase 2. Phase one will be E. Falls Church to Wiehle Avenue in Reston, and Phase 2 will be Wiehle Avenue to Dulles Airport through to Ashburn. Funding for the ongoing development comes from federal, state, Fairfax County, Loudoun County, MWAA (Aviation), and MWAA (toll roads), and costs approximately \$5.5 billion. It is the most expensive project in the USA right now, according to Mr. Looney.

In Tyson's Corner, there are approximately 120,000 jobs and 17,000 residences, causing a jobs-to-housing imbalance of 6-to-1. There are no libraries, firehouses, or schools. Plans are in place to add much more residential development, and reduce the ratio of residential to commercial development. Further information can be found at www.dullesmetro.com.
