**Doug McGill** introduced speaker **Rosemary Tran Lauer**. He met Rosemary through her husband, real estate agent Bill Lauer. Lauer arranged Doug's office's move to Sterling in 2004.

Ms. Lauer left Vietnam in 1975 and came to Washington where she worked three jobs to support her children. She worried about the kind of care her children received. Later she became a business owner, married Bill Lauer, and raised seven children. She explained that parents can pay more for child care than for their child's college education. In Fairfax County, 4,483 children under the age of five live in poverty. Child care costs 34% of a single mother's income. She began the nonprofit Devotion to Children to advocate for affordable quality child care and education. Her organization partners with good quality child care centers like the YMCA, Laurel Learning Center and Cornerstones in Reston. It paid for two Head Start programs to buy computers so children could read books on-line. It also sponsors children going to a YMCA summer camp and offers scholarships to children whose parents cannot afford the whole cost of child care, even with a government subsidy. Parents lose the government child care subsidy when they lose their job. Devotion to Children will pay the cost of child care while the parent look for work so there is no disruption in the care the child receives. The organization is all volunteer and

### Happy Talk - June 10, 2014

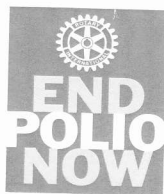

1. By the time the world is certified polio-free, Rotary's Contributions to the global polio eradication effort will be **nearly US\$650 million**.
2. Since 1988, **5 million people**, who otherwise would be paralyzed with polio, are now walking because of Rotary efforts.
3. Rotary and its global partners vaccinated over **2 billion children** in 2005.
4. More than **1 million Rotarians** worldwide have contributed toward polio eradication efforts.
