Lynn Heinrichs introduced Dale "Bio" Baranek, a former Topgun instructor and author of *Topgun Days*. Mr. Baranek provided an overview of his successful, fascinating, and often exciting 20-year career with the U.S. Navy, including assignments to F-14 Tomcat squadrons, the elite Topgun training program, and the Joint Chiefs of Staff at the Pentagon.

When less than 20/20 vision kept Baranek from fulfilling his lifelong dream of becoming a fighter pilot, he trained as a radar intercept officer on F-14 Tomcat fighter jets. In this capacity, he operated the plane's radar weapons system, served as co-pilot, and handled communications and navigation. The F-14s had a dual mission: a traditional fighting mission (during peacetime roaming through potential enemy airspace) and a mission to protect the air space around our aircraft carriers.

After completing his training, Baranek was asked to serve as an instructor at the Topgun training program, teaching the Navy's and Marine Corps' best fighter pilots. In reflecting on his experience as a Topgun instructor, he indicated that hard work, teamwork and cooperation, training and preparation, commitment, and respect were the key to success in Topgun school and in a naval career. He noted that these are life lessons applicable to any career. He attributes his survival in the crash of one of his planes to superb training and preparation.

Baranak also regaled us with stories of the making of the 1986 movie "Top Gun," starring Tom Cruise. While serving as a Topgun instructor, Baranek flew some of the aerial sequences used in the film and also served as a technical adviser on the script. When asked how realistic was the storyline, he said "it was not a documentary." More information can be found at www.topgunbio.com.
