Bill noted that the aim of the Games is to honor the courage and dedication of first responder heroes from around the world. In the United States, participants will include police, firefighters, FBI agents, and other safety personnel who work on our behalf at the community, state, and federal levels. The Games will involve over 12,000 athletes from more than 70 countries. These athletes will participate in more than 60 sporting and profession-specific events that will take place in 53 arenas and venues in Fairfax County and throughout the National Capital Region.

The opening ceremonies, which require a ticket, will be held at RFK Stadium. Competitions are open to the public and will be held June 26 through July 5. Closing ceremonies will occur at Wolf Trap.
