

ROTARY LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE FACULTY TRAINING IN ANNAPOLIS

I can't believe it. In less than three months on Saturday, May 16th District 7620 will have its inaugural Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) Faculty Training in Annapolis, MD for all Part 3 graduates and current RLI Faculty.

This event should be amazing! Why?

First, the RLI faculty training is happening right here in District 7620. Traditionally this course is conducted in Richmond, VA or Charlotte, NC. This requires District 7620 participants to drive between four to eight hours and spend two to three nights down south. Our program is in our own backyard!

Second, the Richmond and Charlotte total programs cost between \$300 to \$400 per person. Our program's costs are an astounding \$25 per person. Yes, I said \$25 per person.

Third, our program is only for new and seasoned RLI faculty. We will offer two distinct sessions. One for new faculty who have completed RLI Part 3 and now want to learn how to facilitate RLI Parts 1, 2 and 3 courses. And a separate session for our current "seasoned" RLI faculty who want to learn and practice the new RLI Parts 1, 2 and 3 curriculum.

And fourth, our new pilot program is only for RLI faculty. We will not be providing the Parts 1, 2, and 3 courses. Our training is truly only for RLI Parts 3 graduates or current RLI faculty. It just does not get better than this!

If you want to learn to be a new RLI faculty trainer or refresh your RLI facilitation skills, I encourage you to sign up today. The deadline for register for this special District 7620

RLI program is Monday, May 4th. Each session is limited to "only" 20 Rotarians per session, and I anticipate that this program will fill quickly.
