



The Spanish Speaking Book provides a valuable tool for verbal interaction between parent and child . Having the opportunity to discuss their child's journey with cancer in their native language is seen as a critical part of understanding the road ahead.







#### 2020 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament Squares Pool

March Madness is a three week period packed will buzzer beaters, Cinderella teams, and a sports fan's dream. Check out our March Madness Squares pool format. Every game of the tournament will have a winner!

There is a 100-square grid — each square will be sold for \$20, making a total pot of \$2,000. Since this is a fundraiser — we will split the pot 50/50. Rotary Club of Catonsville Rotary will get \$1,000 and the payout to the winners will be \$1,000. After all the squares have all been sold, the squares and numbers will be randomly assigned and the grid will be distributed to participants.

The same numbers will be used for all games during and after the First Round (63 games). The play-in games (i.e. First Four) are not included.

The 63 game tournament starts on Thursday, March 19th and ends on Monday, April 6th.

The last digits of the final score of each game will be used to determine the winning squares. The numbers across the top of the grid will represent the winning teams. The numbers down the left side of the grid will represent the losing teams. This format makes it possible to win multiple games with the same numbers.
